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## Associations of "For puzzle" (30 Words)

<b>abstruse</b>	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>An <b>abstruse</b> philosophical inquiry.</i>
<a href="#"><u>arcane</u></a>	Understood by few; mysterious or secret. <i>The <b>arcane</b> science of dowsing.</i>
<b>baffle</b>	A device used to restrain the flow of a fluid, gas, etc. or to prevent the spreading of sound or light in a particular direction. <i>An unexplained occurrence that <b>baffled</b> everyone.</i>
<b>confound</b>	Overthrow (an enemy). <i>He was forever <b>confounding</b> managerialism with idealism.</i>
<a href="#"><u>conundrum</u></a>	A difficult problem. <i>One of the most difficult <b>conundrums</b> for the experts.</i>
<b>convoluted</b>	Highly complex or intricate and occasionally devious. <i><b>Convoluted</b> legal language.</i>
<b>crossword</b>	A puzzle in which words corresponding to numbered clues are to be found and written in to squares in the puzzle. <i>She settled down to do the <b>crossword</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>cryptic</u></a>	Having a secret or hidden meaning- John Gunther. <i><b>Cryptic</b> writings.</i>
<b>cryptogram</b>	A piece of writing in code or cipher.
<a href="#"><u>enigma</u></a>	A difficult problem. <i>Madeleine was still an <b>enigma</b> to him.</i>
<b>enigmatic</b>	Not clear to the understanding. <i>He took the money with an <b>enigmatic</b> smile.</i>
<b>esoteric</b>	Intended for or likely to be understood by only a small number of people with a specialized knowledge or interest. <i><b>Esoteric</b> philosophical debates.</i>

<b>esoterica</b>	Secrets known only to an initiated minority. <i>A professor of such <b>esoterica</b> as angelology and comparative shamanism.</i>
<b><u>inexplicable</u></b>	Unable to be explained or accounted for. <i>For some <b>inexplicable</b> reason her mind went completely blank.</i>
<b>jigsaw</b>	A puzzle consisting of a picture printed on cardboard or wood and cut into various pieces of different shapes that have to be fitted together. <i>Help the police put all the pieces of the <b>jigsaw</b> together.</i>
<b><u>labyrinthine</u></b>	(of a network) like a labyrinth; irregular and twisting. <i><b>Labyrinthine</b> streets and alleys.</i>
<b><u>maze</u></b>	Something jumbled or confused. <i>The house has a <b>maze</b> and a walled Italian garden.</i>
<b>memento</b>	A reminder of past events. <i>You can purchase a <b>memento</b> of your visit.</i>
<b>mysterious</b>	(of a location) having an atmosphere of strangeness or secrecy. <i>His colleague had vanished in <b>mysterious</b> circumstances.</i>
<b><u>mystery</u></b>	Something that baffles understanding and cannot be explained. <i>Much of her past is shrouded in <b>mystery</b>.</i>
<b><u>puzzling</u></b>	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. <i>A <b>puzzling</b> statement.</i>
<b>rebus</b>	A puzzle in which words are represented by combinations of pictures and individual letters; for instance, apex might be represented by a picture of an ape followed by a letter X.
<b>recondite</b>	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>Some <b>recondite</b> problem in historiography.</i>
<b>riddle</b>	Speak in or pose riddles. <i>He who knows not how to <b>riddle</b>.</i>
<b>secret</b>	Given in confidence or in secret. <i>A <b>secret</b> bride.</i>
<b>sibylline</b>	Having a secret or hidden meaning. <i>His fascinating if sometimes <b>sibylline</b> meditations on the nation.</i>
<b>solve</b>	Find the solution to (a problem or question) or understand the meaning of. <i><b>Solve</b> an equation.</i>
<b><u>trivia</u></b>	Something of small importance. <i>We fill our days with meaningless <b>trivia</b>.</i>
<b><u>unfathomable</u></b>	Of depth; not capable of being sounded or measured. <i>Her grey eyes were dark with some <b>unfathomable</b> emotion.</i>
