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Associations of "For puzzle" (30 Words)

abstruse	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>An abstruse philosophical inquiry.</i>
<u>arcane</u>	Understood by few; mysterious or secret. <i>The arcane science of dowsing.</i>
baffle	A device used to restrain the flow of a fluid, gas, etc. or to prevent the spreading of sound or light in a particular direction. <i>An unexplained occurrence that baffled everyone.</i>
confound	Overthrow (an enemy). <i>He was forever confounding managerialism with idealism.</i>
<u>conundrum</u>	A difficult problem. <i>One of the most difficult conundrums for the experts.</i>
convoluted	Highly complex or intricate and occasionally devious. <i>Convoluted legal language.</i>
crossword	A puzzle in which words corresponding to numbered clues are to be found and written in to squares in the puzzle. <i>She settled down to do the crossword.</i>
<u>cryptic</u>	Having a secret or hidden meaning- John Gunther. <i>Cryptic writings.</i>
cryptogram	A piece of writing in code or cipher.
<u>enigma</u>	A difficult problem. <i>Madeleine was still an enigma to him.</i>
enigmatic	Not clear to the understanding. <i>He took the money with an enigmatic smile.</i>
esoteric	Intended for or likely to be understood by only a small number of people with a specialized knowledge or interest. <i>Esoteric philosophical debates.</i>

esoterica	Secrets known only to an initiated minority. <i>A professor of such esoterica as angelology and comparative shamanism.</i>
<u>inexplicable</u>	Unable to be explained or accounted for. <i>For some inexplicable reason her mind went completely blank.</i>
jigsaw	A puzzle consisting of a picture printed on cardboard or wood and cut into various pieces of different shapes that have to be fitted together. <i>Help the police put all the pieces of the jigsaw together.</i>
<u>labyrinthine</u>	(of a network) like a labyrinth; irregular and twisting. <i>Labyrinthine streets and alleys.</i>
<u>maze</u>	Something jumbled or confused. <i>The house has a maze and a walled Italian garden.</i>
memento	A reminder of past events. <i>You can purchase a memento of your visit.</i>
mysterious	(of a location) having an atmosphere of strangeness or secrecy. <i>His colleague had vanished in mysterious circumstances.</i>
<u>mystery</u>	Something that baffles understanding and cannot be explained. <i>Much of her past is shrouded in mystery.</i>
<u>puzzling</u>	Lacking clarity of meaning; causing confusion or perplexity. <i>A puzzling statement.</i>
rebus	A puzzle in which words are represented by combinations of pictures and individual letters; for instance, apex might be represented by a picture of an ape followed by a letter X.
recondite	Difficult to penetrate; incomprehensible to one of ordinary understanding or knowledge. <i>Some recondite problem in historiography.</i>
riddle	Speak in or pose riddles. <i>He who knows not how to riddle.</i>
secret	Given in confidence or in secret. <i>A secret bride.</i>
sibylline	Having a secret or hidden meaning. <i>His fascinating if sometimes sibylline meditations on the nation.</i>
solve	Find the solution to (a problem or question) or understand the meaning of. <i>Solve an equation.</i>
<u>trivia</u>	Something of small importance. <i>We fill our days with meaningless trivia.</i>
<u>unfathomable</u>	Of depth; not capable of being sounded or measured. <i>Her grey eyes were dark with some unfathomable emotion.</i>
