hinder Hinder or prevent the progress or accomplishment of.

The **hinder** part of a carcass.

**inhibit** reduce the activity of (an enzyme or other agent).

interdict An authoritative prohibition.

*Army efforts to interdict enemy supply shipments.* 

modulate Change from one key to another.

The state attempts to **modulate** private business s cash flow.

**preclude** Prevent from happening; make impossible.

His difficulties **preclude** him from leading a normal life.

The quality of being more noticeable than anything else.

**predominance** The **predominance** of women in such professions as social work and

nursing.

**prohibitory** Tending to discourage (especially of prices.

The action of subduing someone or something by force.

**repression** Children and adults pay a heavy price for their deep **repression** of

thoughts about death.
