## Associations of "For servant" (30 Words)

<b>allegiant</b>	That owes or gives allegiance (to someone or something); loyal, faithful. <i>It is impossible to be <b>allegiant</b> to two opposing forces.</i>
<b>butler</b>	The chief manservant of a house.
<b><a href="#">cleaner</a></b>	A device for cleaning such as a vacuum cleaner. <i>My suit s at the <b>cleaners</b>.</i>
<b>dutiful</b>	Willingly obedient out of a sense of duty and respect. <i>A <b>dutiful</b> child.</i>
<b>enslave</b>	Make a slave of; bring into servitude. <i>They were <b>enslaved</b> by their need to take drugs.</i>
<b>epigone</b>	An inferior imitator of some distinguished writer, artist, or musician. <i>The humdrum compositions of some of Beethoven s <b>epigones</b>.</i>
<b>factotum</b>	A servant employed to do a variety of jobs. <i>He was employed as the general <b>factotum</b>.</i>
<b>fawning</b>	Attempting to win favor by flattery. <i><b>Fawning</b> adoration.</i>
<b><a href="#">flatter</a></b>	Lavish praise and compliments on (someone), often insincerely and with the aim of furthering one's own interests. <i>She was <b>flattering</b> him in order to avoid doing what he wanted.</i>
<b><a href="#">flattery</a></b>	Excessive and insincere praise, given especially to further one's own interests. <i>She allowed no hint of <b>flattery</b> to enter her voice.</i>
<b>follower</b>	A person who moves or travels behind someone or something. <i>She remains an immensely divisive figure but she has a million <b>followers</b> on Facebook.</i>
<b>footman</b>	A soldier in the infantry.
<b>groveling</b>	Totally submissive.

<b>henchman</b>	A faithful follower or political supporter, especially one prepared to engage in crime or violence by way of service. <i>The dictator s <b>henchman</b>.</i>
<b>hireling</b>	A person who works purely for material reward. <i>The government s paid <b>hirelings</b> assure us that we re on our way out of recession.</i>
<u><b>housekeeper</b></u>	A person employed to perform cleaning and other domestic tasks in a hotel or institution.
<b>ingratiate</b>	Bring oneself into favour with someone by flattering or trying to please them. <i>A sycophantic attempt to <b>ingratiate</b> herself with the local aristocracy.</i>
<b>ingratiating</b>	Intended to gain approval or favour; sycophantic. <i>With open arms and an <b>ingratiating</b> smile.</i>
<b>lackey</b>	A male servant (especially a footman). <i><b>Lackeys</b> were waiting to help them from the carriage.</i>
<u><b>maid</b></u>	A female domestic. <i>Mary eventually managed to find a job as a <b>maid</b>.</i>
<u><b>minion</b></u>	A servile or fawning dependant. <i>He gets oppressed <b>minions</b> like me to fob them off.</i>
<u><b>obedient</b></u>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>A docile and <b>obedient</b> dog.</i>
<u><b>obsequious</b></u>	Obedient or attentive to an excessive or servile degree. <i>They were served by <b>obsequious</b> waiters.</i>
<u><b>parasite</b></u>	A person who habitually relies on or exploits others and gives nothing in return. <i>The <b>parasite</b> attaches itself to the mouths of fishes.</i>
<b>servile</b>	Submissive or fawning in attitude or behavior. <i>The incurably <b>servile</b> housekeeper.</i>
<b>submissive</b>	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant. <i><b>Submissive</b> servants.</i>
<b>sycophant</b>	A person who tries to please someone in order to gain a personal advantage.
<b>sycophantic</b>	Attempting to win favor from influential people by flattery. <i>A <b>sycophantic</b> interview.</i>
<b>toady</b>	Act in an obsequious way. <i>She imagined him <b>toadying</b> to his rich clients.</i>

**unctuous** (chiefly of minerals) having a greasy or soapy feel.  
*He seemed anxious to please but not in an **unctuous** way.*
