## Associations of "For slightly" (30 Words)

<b>bit</b>	The cutting part of a drill usually pointed and threaded and is replaceable in a brace or bitstock or drill press. <i>Miranda could go off and do her theatrical <b>bit</b>.</i>
<b>fairly</b>	To certain extent or degree. <i>I was <b>fairly</b> certain she had nothing to do with the affair.</i>
<b>few</b>	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `a'; a small but indefinite number. <i>A world that increasingly belongs to the <b>few</b>.</i>
<b>handful</b>	A quantity that fills the hand. <i>Only a <b>handful</b> of people were in the pub.</i>
<b>insignificant</b>	Small and unimpressive. <i>An <b>insignificant</b> sum of money.</i>
<b>just</b>	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i><b>Just</b> a scratch.</i>
<b>least</b>	Used in names of very small animals and plants e g least shrew. <i>My best routine was the one I had practised the <b>least</b>.</i>
<b>less</b>	To a smaller extent; not so much. <i>He listened <b>less</b> to the answer than to Kate s voice.</i>
<b>little</b>	Used in names of animals and plants that are smaller than related kinds e g little grebe. <i>When she was <b>little</b> she was always getting into scrapes.</i>
<b>marginally</b>	In a marginal manner. <i>Inflation is predicted to drop <b>marginally</b>.</i>
<b>mere</b>	Used to emphasize that the fact of something being present in a situation is enough to influence that situation. <i>Questions that cannot be answered by <b>mere</b> mortals.</i>
<b>mini</b>	Denoting a miniature version of something. <i>A <b>mini</b> camera.</i>

<b>minimal</b>	The least possible. <i>P and b are a <b>minimal</b> pair distinguished by the feature of voicing.</i>
<b>minimum</b>	The smallest possible quantity. <i>This can be done with the <b>minimum</b> amount of effort.</i>
<b>minor</b>	A minor term or premise. <i>A <b>minor</b> share of the profits.</i>
<b>moderately</b>	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>Growth continues <b>moderately</b>.</i>
<b>partially</b>	In part; in some degree; not wholly. <i>A <b>partially</b> open door.</i>
<b>partly</b>	To some extent; in some degree; not wholly. <i>You re only <b>partly</b> right.</i>
<b>pinprick</b>	A very small dot or amount. <i>Compared with the indignities he had so far endured this was a mere <b>pinprick</b>.</i>
<b>preferably</b>	Ideally; if possible. <i>He would like a place of his own <b>preferably</b> outside the town.</i>
<b>rather</b>	Used to indicate one's preference in a particular matter. <i>This opens up a whole can of worms that should <b>rather</b> be left shut.</i>
<b>reasonably</b>	Inexpensively. <i>Acted quite <b>reasonably</b>.</i>
<b>slight</b>	Lacking substance or significance. <i>A Council determined whether the Fort should be kept or <b>slighted</b>.</i>
<b>smattering</b>	A slight superficial knowledge of a language or subject. <i>Edward had only a <b>smattering</b> of Welsh.</i>
<b>some</b>	To some extent quite a lot. <i>Having <b>some</b> friends over.</i>
<b>somewhat</b>	To certain extent or degree. <i>Matters have improved <b>somewhat</b> since then.</i>
<b>soupcon</b>	A slight but appreciable amount.
<b>tapered</b>	Becoming gradually narrower. <i>Trousers with <b>tapered</b> legs.</i>
<b>trifling</b>	Unimportant or trivial. <i>A <b>trifling</b> matter.</i>
<b>undersized</b>	Of less than the usual size. <i>The <b>undersized</b> cubs may not survive the winter.</i>
