bit	The cutting part of a drill usually pointed and threaded and is replaceable in a brace or bitstock or drill press. <i>Miranda could go off and do her theatrical bit.</i>
fairly	To certain extent or degree. <i>I was fairly certain she had nothing to do with the affair.</i>
few	A quantifier that can be used with count nouns and is often preceded by `a'; a small but indefinite number. <i>A world that increasingly belongs to the few.</i>
handful	A quantity that fills the hand. <i>Only a handful of people were in the pub.</i>
insignificant	Small and unimpressive. <i>An insignificant sum of money.</i>
just	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>Just a scratch.</i>
least	Used in names of very small animals and plants e g least shrew. <i>My best routine was the one I had practised the least.</i>
less	To a smaller extent; not so much. <i>He listened less to the answer than to Kate s voice.</i>
little	Used in names of animals and plants that are smaller than related kinds e g little grebe. <i>When she was little she was always getting into scrapes.</i>
marginally	In a marginal manner. <i>Inflation is predicted to drop marginally.</i>
mere	Used to emphasize that the fact of something being present in a situation is enough to influence that situation. <i>Questions that cannot be answered by mere mortals.</i>
mini	Denoting a miniature version of something. <i>A mini camera.</i>

minimal	The least possible. <i>P and b are a minimal pair distinguished by the feature of voicing.</i>
minimum	The smallest possible quantity. <i>This can be done with the minimum amount of effort.</i>
minor	A minor term or premise. <i>A minor share of the profits.</i>
moderately	To a moderately sufficient extent or degree. <i>Growth continues moderately.</i>
partially	In part; in some degree; not wholly. <i>A partially open door.</i>
partly	To some extent; in some degree; not wholly. <i>You re only partly right.</i>
pinprick	A very small dot or amount. <i>Compared with the indignities he had so far endured this was a mere pinprick.</i>
preferably	Ideally; if possible. <i>He would like a place of his own preferably outside the town.</i>
rather	Used to indicate one's preference in a particular matter. <i>This opens up a whole can of worms that should rather be left shut.</i>
reasonably	Inexpensively. <i>Acted quite reasonably.</i>
slight	Lacking substance or significance. <i>A Council determined whether the Fort should be kept or slighted.</i>
smattering	A slight superficial knowledge of a language or subject. <i>Edward had only a smattering of Welsh.</i>
some	To some extent quite a lot. <i>Having some friends over.</i>
somewhat	To certain extent or degree. <i>Matters have improved somewhat since then.</i>
soupcon	A slight but appreciable amount.
tapered	Becoming gradually narrower. <i>Trousers with tapered legs.</i>
trifling	Unimportant or trivial. <i>A trifling matter.</i>
undersized	Of less than the usual size. <i>The undersized cubs may not survive the winter.</i>
