chase	United States politician and jurist who served as chief justice of the United States Supreme Court (1808-1873). <i>Police chased the stolen car through the city.</i>

<u>discovery</u>	The act of discovering something. <i>The drug is not a new discovery.</i>
explore	Travel through (an unfamiliar area) in order to learn about it. <i>He decided to explore the lesion to establish the diagnosis.</i>
find	Get or find back recover the use of. <i>Phobia sufferers often find themselves virtual prisoners in their own home.</i>
finding	The action of finding someone or something. <i>The findings in the gastrointestinal tract indicate that he died several hours after dinner.</i>
forage	Wander and feed. <i>The birds forage for aquatic invertebrates insects and seeds.</i>
<u>gawk</u>	Stare openly and stupidly. <i>Let those country gawks dance to their hearts content.</i>
goggle	The staggers (a disease of sheep). <i>Their goggle mesmerizes even fishmongers.</i>
hide-and-seek	Inquire for.
hound	Used in names of dogfishes e g nurse hound smooth hound. <i>His opponents used the allegations to hound him out of office.</i>
hunt	Use a hound or a horse for hunting. <i>Lionesses hunt in groups.</i>
<u>hunting</u>	The activity of hunting wild animals or game. <i>Whale hunting is unnecessary.</i>

investigate	Investigate scientifically. <i>Everyone with a possible interest in your brother's death must be thoroughly investigated.</i>
microscope	Magnifier of the image of small objects. <i>The invention of the microscope led to the discovery of the cell.</i>
microscopy	The use of the microscope.
observation	The act of taking the altitude of the sun or another celestial body to find a latitude or longitude. <i>He made a telling observation about Hughie.</i>
pursue	Carry out or participate in an activity; be involved in. <i>Andrew was determined to pursue a computer career.</i>
pursuit	The action of pursuing someone or something. <i>Those whose business is the pursuit of knowledge.</i>
quest	Express the need or desire for; ask for. <i>A quest for wealth.</i>
research	Engaged in or intended for research. <i>She has spent the last five years researching her people's history.</i>
rummage	(of a customs officer) make a thorough search of (a vessel). <i>He gave the attic a good rummage but couldn't find his skis.</i>
scan	An image obtained by scanning or with a scanner. <i>The beams scanned the night sky.</i>
scavenger	A substance that reacts with and removes particular molecules, groups, etc. <i>4 aminosalicylic acid is not an effective free radical scavenger.</i>
scour	A place that is scoured especially by running water. <i>The scour of the tide may cause lateral erosion.</i>
scrutinize	To look at critically or searchingly, or in minute detail. <i>Customers were warned to scrutinize the small print.</i>
search	An act of searching for someone or something. <i>You can search for recipes by topic or by entering a keyword.</i>
shooting	The sport or pastime of shooting with a gun. <i>The events that led up to the shooting of the man.</i>
try	An act of trying something new or different to see if it is suitable, effective or pleasant. <i>She agreed that they should give the idea a try.</i>

vault

A strongroom or compartment (often made of steel) for safekeeping of valuables.
