## Associations of "For spooky" (30 Words)

<a href="#">afraid</a>	Feeling fear or anxiety; frightened. <i>Terribly <b>afraid</b> of offending someone.</i>
<a href="#">alarming</a>	Worrying or disturbing. <i>Our countryside is disappearing at an <b>alarming</b> rate.</i>
<b>appall</b>	Fill with apprehension or alarm; cause to be unpleasantly surprised.
<a href="#">appalling</a>	Causing shock or dismay; horrific. <i><b>Appalling</b> conditions.</i>
<a href="#">astounding</a>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>The summit offers <b>astounding</b> views.</i>
<a href="#">atrocious</a>	Exceptionally bad or displeasing. <i><b>Atrocious</b> weather.</i>
<a href="#">diabolical</a>	Characteristic of the Devil, or so evil as to be suggestive of the Devil. <i>The <b>diabolical</b> expression on his face.</i>
<a href="#">dreadful</a>	Extremely disagreeable. <i>You re a <b>dreadful</b> flirt.</i>
<b>eerie</b>	Strange and frightening. <i>An <b>eerie</b> midnight howl.</i>
<a href="#">excitable</a>	Capable of responding to stimuli. <i>A rather <b>excitable</b> young man.</i>
<b>fearful</b>	Causing or likely to cause people to be afraid; horrifying. <i>He was in a <b>fearful</b> hurry.</i>
<b>fearfulness</b>	An emotion experienced in anticipation of some specific pain or danger (usually accompanied by a desire to flee or fight).
<b>fright</b>	Frighten. <i>Ghosts could never <b>affright</b> her.</i>
<a href="#">frightening</a>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>A <b>frightening</b> experience.</i>

<b>frightful</b>	Extreme in degree or extent or amount or impact. <i>There s been a most <b>frightful</b> accident.</i>
<b>ghastly</b>	Extremely unwell. <i>One of the most <b>ghastly</b> crimes ever committed.</i>
<b>grisly</b>	Causing horror or disgust. <i>A <b>grisly</b> murder.</i>
<b>gruesome</b>	Extremely unpleasant. <i><b>Gruesome</b> catering.</i>
<b>hellish</b>	Extremely (used for emphasis). <i><b>Hellish</b> torture.</i>
<b>hideous</b>	Grossly offensive to decency or morality; causing horror. <i>The whole <b>hideous</b> story.</i>
<b>horrific</b>	Causing horror. <i><b>Horrific</b> conditions in the mining industry.</i>
<b>horrifying</b>	Causing horror; extremely shocking. <i>An alarming even <b>horrifying</b> picture.</i>
<b>horror</b>	A literary or film genre concerned with arousing feelings of horror. <i>The mere thought of it gives me the <b>horrors</b>.</i>
<b>macabre</b>	Shockingly repellent; inspiring horror. <i><b>Macabre</b> tales of war and plague in the Middle ages.</i>
<b>scared</b>	Fearful; frightened. <i>He s <b>scared</b> to come to you and ask for help.</i>
<b>scary</b>	Provoking fear terror. <i>It was <b>scary</b> the way they bonded with each other.</i>
<b>skittish</b>	(of a person) playfully frivolous or unpredictable. <i>A <b>skittish</b> chestnut mare.</i>
<b>spectral</b>	Of or relating to a spectrum. <i>A <b>spectral</b> menacing face.</i>
<b>terrible</b>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>A <b>terrible</b> curse.</i>
<b>terrifying</b>	Causing extreme terror. <i>The <b>terrifying</b> events of the past few weeks.</i>
