<b>abiding</b>	Unceasing. <i>He had an <b>abiding</b> respect for her.</i>
<b>changeless</b>	Unvarying in nature. <i><b>Changeless</b> truths.</i>
<b>confirmed</b>	(of a person) firmly established in a particular habit, belief, or way of life and unlikely to change their ways. <i>A <b>confirmed</b> Catholic.</i>
<b>constancy</b>	(psychology) the tendency for perceived objects to give rise to very similar perceptual experiences in spite of wide variations in the conditions of observation. <i>Early mariners relied on the <b>constancy</b> of the trade winds.</i>
<b>constant</b>	A number representing a quantity assumed to have a fixed value in a specified mathematical context. <i>Maintained a <b>constant</b> temperature.</i>
<b>durability</b>	Permanence by virtue of the power to resist stress or force. <i>The reliability and <b>durability</b> of plastics.</i>
<b> durable</b>	Very long lasting. <i>A <b>durable</b> peace can be achieved.</i>
<b>fixed</b>	Of a number having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>The fight s <b>fixed</b> the ref has your card marked.</i>
<b>immobile</b>	Securely fixed in place. <i>An <b>immobile</b> workforce.</i>
<b>immobility</b>	Remaining in place. <i>The disorder is caused by long periods of <b>immobility</b>.</i>
<b>immovable</b>	Immovable property. <i>An <b>immovable</b> article of faith.</i>
<b>immutable</b>	Constant and unchanging. <i>The <b>immutable</b> laws of nature.</i>

<b>indelible</b>	Cannot be removed or erased. <i>The story made an <b>indelible</b> impression on me.</i>
<b>indestructible</b>	Not easily destroyed. <i><b>Indestructible</b> plastic containers.</i>
<b>invariable</b>	A quantity that does not vary. <i>His routine was <b>invariable</b>.</i>
<u>lasting</u>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A long <b>lasting</b> friendship.</i>
<u>sedentary</u>	Requiring sitting or little activity. <i>A <b>sedentary</b> lifestyle spells bad news for hips and thighs.</i>
<b>settled</b>	Established or decided beyond dispute or doubt. <i><b>Settled</b> areas.</i>
<u>stability</u>	The state of being stable. <i>There are fears for the political <b>stability</b> of the area.</i>
<b>standing</b>	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>A <b>standing</b> committee.</i>
<u>static</u>	Relating to statics. <i>The whole ballet appeared too <b>static</b>.</i>
<b>statics</b>	The branch of mechanics concerned with bodies at rest and forces in equilibrium.
<b>steadfast</b>	Marked by firm determination or resolution; not shakable. <i><b>Steadfast</b> loyalty.</i>
<u>steady</u>	Support or hold steady and make steadfast with or as if with a brace. <i>A <b>steady</b> gaze.</i>
<u>stiff</u>	In a stiff manner. <i>His hands lay <b>stiffly</b>.</i>
<u>unchangeable</u>	Not changeable or subject to change. <i>A fixed and <b>unchangeable</b> part of the germ plasm.</i>
<u>unchanging</u>	Not changing; remaining the same. <i>The party stood for <b>unchanging</b> principles.</i>
<b>unmoving</b>	Not arousing emotions. <i>This must be the most <b>unmoving</b> performance of Verdi's opera ever recorded.</i>
<b>unswerving</b>	Firm and dependable especially in loyalty. <i><b>Unswerving</b> loyalty.</i>
<u>unwavering</u>	Not showing abrupt variations- Louis Auchincloss. <i>She fixed him with an <b>unwavering</b> stare.</i>
