## Associations of "For stumble" (30 Words)

<b>abruptly</b>	In a rude or curt manner. <i>The film ends rather <b>abruptly</b>.</i>
<b>balk</b>	The area on a billiard table behind the balkline. <i>He <b>balked</b> at such a drastic solution.</i>
<b>blunder</b>	Make one’s way clumsily or blindly. <i>I <b>blundered</b> during the job interview.</i>
<b>clanger</b>	A conspicuous mistake whose effects seem to reverberate. <i>He dropped a <b>clanger</b>.</i>
<b>defect</b>	A shortcoming, imperfection, or lack. <i>This device permits detection of <b>defects</b> in the lungs.</i>
<b>deterrent</b>	A nuclear weapon or weapons system regarded as deterring an enemy from attack. <i>Britain s nuclear <b>deterrent</b>.</i>
<a href="#">doubt</a>	Consider unlikely or have doubts about. <i>I <b>doubt</b> that she will accept his proposal of marriage.</i>
<b>fall</b>	Descend in free fall under the influence of gravity. <i><b>Fall</b> prey to an imposter.</i>
<b>falter</b>	Speak hesitantly. <i>The music <b>faltered</b> stopped and started up again.</i>
<b>foot</b>	An army unit consisting of soldiers who fight on foot. <i>An 8 <b>foot</b> reed stop.</i>
<a href="#">glide</a>	Fly in or as if in a glider plane. <i>The cuckoo makes its approach in a hawklike <b>glide</b>.</i>
<b>hesitate</b>	Be reluctant to do something. <i>One <b>hesitates</b> over publicizing these things.</i>
<a href="#">impediment</a>	Any structure that makes progress difficult. <i>A serious <b>impediment</b> to scientific progress.</i>

<b><u>lurch</u></b>	Defeat by a lurch. <i>He was <b>lurching</b> from one crisis to the next.</i>
<b>misstep</b>	A clumsy or badly judged step. <i>His campaign has been a farrago of <b>missteps</b> and mixed messages.</i>
<b><u>mumble</u></b>	Talk indistinctly; usually in a low voice. <i>Sorry she <b>mumbled</b>.</i>
<b><u>murmur</u></b>	A rumour. <i>Now they do not simply <b>murmur</b> against him they quarrel noisily with him.</i>
<b><u>obscurity</u></b>	An obscure and unimportant standing; not well known. <i>Poems of impenetrable <b>obscurity</b>.</i>
<b>obstacle</b>	An obstruction that stands in the way (and must be removed or surmounted or circumvented). <i>Lack of imagination is an <b>obstacle</b> to one's advancement.</i>
<b>shakily</b>	In a manner characterized by trembling or shaking.
<b>slip</b>	A fielder at slip. <i>The giant balloon <b>slipped</b> its moorings.</i>
<b>spasmodic</b>	Affected by involuntary jerky muscular contractions; resembling a spasm. <i>His body made a <b>spasmodic</b> jerk.</i>
<b>stagger</b>	(of a blow) cause (someone) to walk or move unsteadily, as if about to fall. <i>He <b>staggered</b> along in the heavy snow.</i>
<b>stammer</b>	A tendency to stammer. <i>As a young man he had a dreadful <b>stammer</b>.</i>
<b><u>stutter</u></b>	A tendency to stutter while speaking. <i>He shyly <b>stuttered</b> out an invitation to the cinema.</i>
<b>suddenly</b>	Quickly and unexpectedly. <i>He made up his mind <b>suddenly</b>.</i>
<b>tone</b>	A musical interval of two semitones. <i><b>Tone</b> a photographic image.</i>
<b>totter</b>	Move without being stable, as if threatening to fall. <i>The drunk man <b>tottered</b> over to our table.</i>
<b>walk</b>	A route recommended or marked out for recreational walking. <i>She <b>walks</b> with a slight limp.</i>
<b>waver</b>	Be undecided between two opinions or courses of action. <i>His love for her had never <b>wavered</b>.</i>
