## Associations of "For the most part" (30 Words)

<b>apportion</b>	Give out as one’s portion or share. <i>They did not <b>apportion</b> blame or liability to any one individual.</i>
<b>bit</b>	The cutting part of a drill usually pointed and threaded and is replaceable in a brace or bitstock or drill press. <i>You could see everything All her <b>bits</b>.</i>
<b>distribution</b>	The spatial or geographic property of being scattered about over a range, area, or volume. <i>A manager has the choice of four types of <b>distribution</b>.</i>
<b>divide</b>	A difference or disagreement between two groups, typically producing tension. <i>The mountain range <b>divides</b> the two countries.</i>
<b>division</b>	A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>An infantry <b>division</b>.</i>
<b>dozen</b>	An exchange of insults engaged in as a game or ritual among black Americans. <i>A <b>dozen</b> bottles of sherry.</i>
<b>fraction</b>	A component of a mixture that has been separated by a fractional process. <i>The dominant classes or <b>fractions</b> in capitalist societies.</i>
<b>fractional</b>	Constituting or comprising a part or fraction of a possible whole or entirety. <i>A <b>fractional</b> share of the vote.</i>
<b>fragment</b>	Break or cause to break into fragments. <i><b>Fragments</b> of a play.</i>
<b>fragmentary</b>	Consisting of small disconnected parts. <i>Excavations have revealed <b>fragmentary</b> remains of masonry.</i>
<b>fragmentation</b>	The process or state of breaking or being broken into fragments. <i><b>Fragmentation</b> slows system performance because it takes extra time to locate and assemble the parts of the fragmented file.</i>

<b>half</b>	To the extent of half. <i>The northern <b>half</b> of the island.</i>
<b>incomplete</b>	Not full or finished. <i>An <b>incomplete</b> account of his life.</i>
<b>least</b>	Used in names of very small animals and plants e.g. least shrew. <i>My best routine was the one I had practised the <b>least</b>.</i>
<b>moiety</b>	One of two (approximately) equal parts. <i>The enzyme removes the sulphate <b>moiety</b>.</i>
<b>nearly</b>	Closely. <i>A rise of <b>nearly</b> 25 per cent.</i>
<b>partially</b>	Only in part; to a limited extent. <i>He was <b>partially</b> paralyzed.</i>
<b>partition</b>	The act of dividing or partitioning separation by the creation of a boundary that divides or keeps apart. <i><b>Partition</b> chromatography.</i>
<b>partly</b>	To some extent; not completely. <i>You re only <b>partly</b> right.</i>
<b>percentage</b>	An amount, such as an allowance or commission, that is a proportion of a larger sum of money. <i>The <b>percentage</b> of Caesareans at the hospital was three per cent higher than the national average.</i>
<b>piece</b>	Slowly make sense of something from separate pieces of evidence. <i>It was a nice <b>piece</b> of work.</i>
<b>portion</b>	Separate (a part of something) from the whole. <i>Eating meals that are <b>portioned</b> out properly will help you avoid binge eating.</i>
<b>proportion</b>	Give pleasant proportions to. <i>A building of vast <b>proportions</b>.</i>
<b>section</b>	Commit someone compulsorily to a psychiatric hospital in accordance with a section of a mental health act. <i>I unscrewed every <b>section</b> of copper pipe from the roof tank to the hot water cylinder.</i>
<b>sector</b>	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>The government aimed to reassure the industrial and commercial <b>sector</b>.</i>
<b>segment</b>	Divide into segments. <i>The market is beginning to <b>segment</b> into a number of well defined categories.</i>

- segmentation** Division of a cell; cleavage.  
***Segmentation** of myocardial cells.*
- share** Give out as one's portion or share.  
*She can't take a **share** in childcare she's a nervous wreck.*
- slat** Equip or bar with slats.  
*Sunlight filtered dustily through the **slats** of the door.*
- some** To some extent quite a lot.  
*We did not meet again for **some** years.*
