Associations of "For the most part" (30 Words)

apportion	Give out as one’s portion or share. <i>They did not apportion blame or liability to any one individual.</i>
bit	The cutting part of a drill usually pointed and threaded and is replaceable in a brace or bitstock or drill press. <i>You could see everything All her bits.</i>
distribution	The spatial or geographic property of being scattered about over a range, area, or volume. <i>A manager has the choice of four types of distribution.</i>
divide	A difference or disagreement between two groups, typically producing tension. <i>The mountain range divides the two countries.</i>
division	A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>An infantry division.</i>
dozen	An exchange of insults engaged in as a game or ritual among black Americans. <i>A dozen bottles of sherry.</i>
fraction	A component of a mixture that has been separated by a fractional process. <i>The dominant classes or fractions in capitalist societies.</i>
fractional	Constituting or comprising a part or fraction of a possible whole or entirety. <i>A fractional share of the vote.</i>
fragment	Break or cause to break into fragments. <i>Fragments of a play.</i>
fragmentary	Consisting of small disconnected parts. <i>Excavations have revealed fragmentary remains of masonry.</i>
fragmentation	The process or state of breaking or being broken into fragments. <i>Fragmentation slows system performance because it takes extra time to locate and assemble the parts of the fragmented file.</i>

half	To the extent of half. <i>The northern half of the island.</i>
incomplete	Not full or finished. <i>An incomplete account of his life.</i>
least	Used in names of very small animals and plants e.g. least shrew. <i>My best routine was the one I had practised the least.</i>
moiety	One of two (approximately) equal parts. <i>The enzyme removes the sulphate moiety.</i>
nearly	Closely. <i>A rise of nearly 25 per cent.</i>
partially	Only in part; to a limited extent. <i>He was partially paralyzed.</i>
partition	The act of dividing or partitioning separation by the creation of a boundary that divides or keeps apart. <i>Partition chromatography.</i>
partly	To some extent; not completely. <i>You re only partly right.</i>
percentage	An amount, such as an allowance or commission, that is a proportion of a larger sum of money. <i>The percentage of Caesareans at the hospital was three per cent higher than the national average.</i>
piece	Slowly make sense of something from separate pieces of evidence. <i>It was a nice piece of work.</i>
portion	Separate (a part of something) from the whole. <i>Eating meals that are portioned out properly will help you avoid binge eating.</i>
proportion	Give pleasant proportions to. <i>A building of vast proportions.</i>
section	Commit someone compulsorily to a psychiatric hospital in accordance with a section of a mental health act. <i>I unscrewed every section of copper pipe from the roof tank to the hot water cylinder.</i>
sector	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>The government aimed to reassure the industrial and commercial sector.</i>
segment	Divide into segments. <i>The market is beginning to segment into a number of well defined categories.</i>

- segmentation** Division of a cell; cleavage.

- share** Give out as one's portion or share.

- slat** Equip or bar with slats.
