## Associations of "For toxic" (30 Words)

<b>antidote</b>	A medicine taken or given to counteract a particular poison. <i>There is no known <b>antidote</b> to the poison of the pufferfish.</i>
<b>carcinogen</b>	A substance capable of causing cancer in living tissue.
<b>carcinogenic</b>	Having the potential to cause cancer.
<b>cholera</b>	An infectious and often fatal bacterial disease of the small intestine, typically contracted from infected water supplies and causing severe vomiting and diarrhoea.
<b>dangerous</b>	Able or likely to cause harm or injury. <i>Insecticides which are <b>dangerous</b> to the environment.</i>
<b>deadly</b>	Filled with hatred or intense rivalry. <i>The seven <b>deadly</b> sins.</i>
<b>detoxify</b>	Remove poison from. <i><b>Detoxify</b> the soil.</i>
<b>dope</b>	Carbonated drink flavored with extract from kola nuts dope is a southernism in the United States. <i>The resistors have been <b>doped</b>.</i>
<b>emission</b>	A substance that is emitted or released. <i>Cuts in carbon dioxide <b>emissions</b>.</i>
<b>exotoxin</b>	A toxin that is secreted by microorganisms into the surrounding medium.
<b><a href="#">fatal</a></b>	Bringing death. <i>There were three <b>fatal</b> flaws in the strategy.</i>
<b>fumes</b>	Gases ejected from an engine as waste products.
<b><a href="#">hazardous</a></b>	Risky; dangerous. <i>We work in <b>hazardous</b> conditions.</i>
<b>herbicide</b>	A chemical agent that destroys plants or inhibits their growth. <i>Farmers sprayed a protected wildflower meadow with <b>herbicide</b>.</i>

<b>mercury</b>	Temperature measured by a mercury thermometer. <i>One wonders how many unfortunates owed their demise to his prescription of <b>mercury</b> to clarify the spleen.</i>
<b>neurotoxin</b>	A poison which acts on the nervous system.
<b>noxious</b>	Injurious to physical or mental health. <i><b>Noxious</b> chemical wastes.</i>
<b>pernicious</b>	Exceedingly harmful. <i>The <b>pernicious</b> influences of the mass media.</i>
<b>poison</b>	Administer poison to a person or animal either deliberately or accidentally. <i>She <b>poisoned</b> her husband.</i>
<b>poisoning</b>	The fact of being affected by or contaminated with poison. <i>The <b>poisoning</b> of a former spy.</i>
<b>poisonous</b>	(of an animal) producing poison as a means of attacking enemies or prey; venomous. <i><b>Poisonous</b> hate.</i>
<b>pollutant</b>	A substance that pollutes something, especially water or the atmosphere. <i>Chemical <b>pollutants</b>.</i>
<b>tarantula</b>	Large hairy tropical spider with fangs that can inflict painful but not highly venomous bites.
<b>tetanus</b>	A sustained muscular contraction resulting from a rapid series of nerve impulses.
<b>toxicity</b>	The quality of being very harmful or unpleasant in a pervasive or insidious way. <i>That was how I protected my partner from my family's <b>toxicity</b>.</i>
<b>toxin</b>	A poison of plant or animal origin, especially one produced by or derived from microorganisms and acting as an antigen in the body.
<b>venom</b>	A poisonous substance secreted by animals such as snakes, spiders, and scorpions and typically injected into prey or aggressors by biting or stinging. <i>A toxin seven times more deadly than cobra <b>venom</b>.</i>
<b>venomous</b>	(of a person or their behaviour) full of malice or spite. <i>The <b>venomous</b> tone of her voice.</i>
<b>virulence</b>	Extreme harmfulness (as the capacity of a microorganism to cause disease). <i>He was clearly pained by the <b>virulence</b> of the attacks.</i>
<b>virulent</b>	(of a pathogen, especially a virus) highly infective. <i>A <b>virulent</b> attack on liberalism.</i>
