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Associations of "For toxic" (30 Words)

antidote	A medicine taken or given to counteract a particular poison. <i>There is no known antidote to the poison of the pufferfish.</i>
carcinogen	A substance capable of causing cancer in living tissue.
carcinogenic	Having the potential to cause cancer.
cholera	An infectious and often fatal bacterial disease of the small intestine, typically contracted from infected water supplies and causing severe vomiting and diarrhoea.
dangerous	Able or likely to cause harm or injury. <i>Insecticides which are dangerous to the environment.</i>
deadly	Filled with hatred or intense rivalry. <i>The seven deadly sins.</i>
detoxify	Remove poison from. <i>Detoxify the soil.</i>
dope	Carbonated drink flavored with extract from kola nuts dope is a southernism in the United States. <i>The resistors have been doped.</i>
emission	A substance that is emitted or released. <i>Cuts in carbon dioxide emissions.</i>
exotoxin	A toxin that is secreted by microorganisms into the surrounding medium.
fatal	Bringing death. <i>There were three fatal flaws in the strategy.</i>
fumes	Gases ejected from an engine as waste products.
hazardous	Risky; dangerous. <i>We work in hazardous conditions.</i>
herbicide	A chemical agent that destroys plants or inhibits their growth. <i>Farmers sprayed a protected wildflower meadow with herbicide.</i>

mercury	Temperature measured by a mercury thermometer. <i>One wonders how many unfortunates owed their demise to his prescription of mercury to clarify the spleen.</i>
neurotoxin	A poison which acts on the nervous system.
noxious	Injurious to physical or mental health. <i>Noxious chemical wastes.</i>
pernicious	Exceedingly harmful. <i>The pernicious influences of the mass media.</i>
poison	Administer poison to a person or animal either deliberately or accidentally. <i>She poisoned her husband.</i>
poisoning	The fact of being affected by or contaminated with poison. <i>The poisoning of a former spy.</i>
poisonous	(of an animal) producing poison as a means of attacking enemies or prey; venomous. <i>Poisonous hate.</i>
pollutant	A substance that pollutes something, especially water or the atmosphere. <i>Chemical pollutants.</i>
tarantula	Large hairy tropical spider with fangs that can inflict painful but not highly venomous bites.
tetanus	A sustained muscular contraction resulting from a rapid series of nerve impulses.
toxicity	The quality of being very harmful or unpleasant in a pervasive or insidious way. <i>That was how I protected my partner from my family's toxicity.</i>
toxin	A poison of plant or animal origin, especially one produced by or derived from microorganisms and acting as an antigen in the body.
venom	A poisonous substance secreted by animals such as snakes, spiders, and scorpions and typically injected into prey or aggressors by biting or stinging. <i>A toxin seven times more deadly than cobra venom.</i>
venomous	(of a person or their behaviour) full of malice or spite. <i>The venomous tone of her voice.</i>
virulence	Extreme harmfulness (as the capacity of a microorganism to cause disease). <i>He was clearly pained by the virulence of the attacks.</i>
virulent	(of a pathogen, especially a virus) highly infective. <i>A virulent attack on liberalism.</i>
