absolutely	With no qualification, restriction, or limitation; totally. <i>An absolutely magnificent painting.</i>
accurately	In a way that is correct in all details; exactly. <i>We are simply unable to predict long term trends accurately.</i>
actuality	Existing conditions or facts. <i>A hope that progressed from possibility to actuality.</i>
actually	As a sentence modifier to add slight emphasis. <i>Large meteorites actually come from the asteroid belt.</i>
appeasing	Intended to pacify by acceding to demands or granting concessions. <i>The appeasing concessions to the Nazis at Munich.</i>
assuredly	Confidently. <i>Potted roses will most assuredly not survive winter without protection.</i>
certainly	Definitely or positively (‘sure’ is sometimes used informally for ‘surely’). <i>Our current revenues are certainly lower than anticipated.</i>
certainty	Something that is certain. <i>A man exuding certainty.</i>
certitude	Total certainty or greater certainty than circumstances warrant. <i>The collapse of the old political certitudes in eastern Europe.</i>
conciliatory	Intended to placate. <i>A conciliatory approach.</i>
correctly	In a way that is true, factual or appropriate; accurately. <i>The flower had been correctly depicted by his son.</i>
definitely	Without doubt (used for emphasis). <i>We couldn't plan to go elsewhere until we had heard from you more definitely.</i>
doubtless	Presumably or very probably. <i>Doubtless you'll solve the problem.</i>

genuinely	Genuinely with authority. <i>People don't genuinely understand what they're dealing with.</i>
indeed	Used to emphasize a description. <i>A ghost indeed I've never heard anything so silly.</i>
indubitably	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i>Indubitably liberalism parades under many guises.</i>
justly	In a way that is well founded; justifiably. <i>We can justly be proud of our achievements.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>Unemployment has been the most obvious cost of the recession.</i>
obviously	In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly. <i>The answer is obviously wrong.</i>
propitiate	Make peace with. <i>The pagans thought it was important to propitiate the gods with sacrifices.</i>
propitiatory	Having power to atone for or offered by way of expiation or propitiation. <i>Sent flowers as a propitiatory gesture.</i>
really	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. <i>I really want to go.</i>
sincerely	Written formula for ending a letter. <i>She praised him sincerely for his victory.</i>
so	Referring back to something previously mentioned. <i>Help without which he would not have done so well.</i>
sure	Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured. <i>I'm sure I've seen that dress before.</i>
surely	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>The results are surely encouraging.</i>
undoubtedly	Without doubt; certainly. <i>They are undoubtedly guilty.</i>
unquestionably	In a way that cannot be disputed or doubted; without question. <i>Fred Winter is unquestionably the jockey to follow.</i>
verily	In truth; certainly. <i>Trust in the Lord and verily thou shalt be fed.</i>
very	Used to emphasize that the following description applies without qualification. <i>The very first time.</i>
