Without doubt (used for emphasis.

definitely.

doubtless Presumably or very probably.

**Doubtless** you ll solve the problem.



**genuinely** Genuinely with authority.

People don t **genuinely** understand what they re dealing with.

indeed Used to emphasize a description.

A ghost **indeed** I ve never heard anything so silly.

indubitably

In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted.

Indubitably liberalism parades under many guises.

justly In a way that is well founded; justifiably.

We can **justly** be proud of our achievements.

**obvious** Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind.

*Unemployment has been the most obvious* cost of the recession.

**obviously** In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly.

The answer is **obviously** wrong.

Make peace with.

**propitiate** The pagans thought it was important to **propitiate** the gods with

sacrifices.

**propitiatory** Having power to atone for or offered by way of expiation or propitiation.

Sent flowers as a **propitiatory** gesture.

Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is
