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## Associations of "For truly" (30 Words)

<b>absolutely</b>	With no qualification, restriction, or limitation; totally. <i>An <b>absolutely</b> magnificent painting.</i>
<b>accurately</b>	In a way that is correct in all details; exactly. <i>We are simply unable to predict long term trends <b>accurately</b>.</i>
<a href="#">actuality</a>	Existing conditions or facts. <i>A hope that progressed from possibility to <b>actuality</b>.</i>
<b>actually</b>	As a sentence modifier to add slight emphasis. <i>Large meteorites <b>actually</b> come from the asteroid belt.</i>
<b>appeasing</b>	Intended to pacify by acceding to demands or granting concessions. <i>The <b>appeasing</b> concessions to the Nazis at Munich.</i>
<a href="#">assuredly</a>	Confidently. <i>Potted roses will most <b>assuredly</b> not survive winter without protection.</i>
<a href="#">certainly</a>	Definitely or positively (‘sure’ is sometimes used informally for ‘surely’). <i>Our current revenues are <b>certainly</b> lower than anticipated.</i>
<a href="#">certainty</a>	Something that is certain. <i>A man exuding <b>certainty</b>.</i>
<b>certitude</b>	Total certainty or greater certainty than circumstances warrant. <i>The collapse of the old political <b>certitudes</b> in eastern Europe.</i>
<b>conciliatory</b>	Intended to placate. <i>A <b>conciliatory</b> approach.</i>
<a href="#">correctly</a>	In a way that is true, factual or appropriate; accurately. <i>The flower had been <b>correctly</b> depicted by his son.</i>
<b>definitely</b>	Without doubt (used for emphasis). <i>We couldn't plan to go elsewhere until we had heard from you more <b>definitely</b>.</i>
<a href="#">doubtless</a>	Presumably or very probably. <i><b>Doubtless</b> you'll solve the problem.</i>

<b>genuinely</b>	Genuinely with authority. <i>People don't <b>genuinely</b> understand what they're dealing with.</i>
<b>indeed</b>	Used to emphasize a description. <i>A ghost <b>indeed</b> I've never heard anything so silly.</i>
<b>indubitably</b>	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i><b>Indubitably</b> liberalism parades under many guises.</i>
<b>justly</b>	In a way that is well founded; justifiably. <i>We can <b>justly</b> be proud of our achievements.</i>
<b>obvious</b>	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>Unemployment has been the most <b>obvious</b> cost of the recession.</i>
<b>obviously</b>	In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly. <i>The answer is <b>obviously</b> wrong.</i>
<b>propitiate</b>	Make peace with. <i>The pagans thought it was important to <b>propitiate</b> the gods with sacrifices.</i>
<b>propitiatory</b>	Having power to atone for or offered by way of expiation or propitiation. <i>Sent flowers as a <b>propitiatory</b> gesture.</i>
<b>really</b>	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. <i>I <b>really</b> want to go.</i>
<b>sincerely</b>	Written formula for ending a letter. <i>She praised him <b>sincerely</b> for his victory.</i>
<b>so</b>	Referring back to something previously mentioned. <i>Help without which he would not have done <b>so</b> well.</i>
<b>sure</b>	Having or feeling no doubt or uncertainty confident and assured. <i>I'm <b>sure</b> I've seen that dress before.</i>
<b>surely</b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>The results are <b>surely</b> encouraging.</i>
<b>undoubtedly</b>	Without doubt; certainly. <i>They are <b>undoubtedly</b> guilty.</i>
<b>unquestionably</b>	In a way that cannot be disputed or doubted; without question. <i>Fred Winter is <b>unquestionably</b> the jockey to follow.</i>
<b>verily</b>	In truth; certainly. <i>Trust in the Lord and <b>verily</b> thou shalt be fed.</i>
<b>very</b>	Used to emphasize that the following description applies without qualification. <i>The <b>very</b> first time.</i>
