<a href="#">amaze</a>	Affect with wonder. <i>Your ability to speak six languages <b>amazes</b> me.</i>
<b>astonish</b>	Surprise or impress (someone) greatly. <i>It <b>astonished</b> her that he was so anxious.</i>
<a href="#">astonishing</a>	Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing. <i>Such an enormous response was <b>astonishing</b>.</i>
<b>astound</b>	Affect with wonder. <i>Her bluntness <b>astounded</b> him.</i>
<a href="#">astounding</a>	Surprisingly impressive or notable. <i>An <b>astounding</b> achievement.</i>
<a href="#">disbelief</a>	Doubt about the truth of something. <i>I ll burn in hell for <b>disbelief</b>.</i>
<b>doubtful</b>	Open to doubt or suspicion. <i>He looked <b>doubtful</b> but gave a nod.</i>
<b>fabulous</b>	Having no basis in reality; mythical. <i><b>Fabulous</b> riches.</i>
<b>farfetched</b>	(of an idea or story) so exaggerated or ludicrous as to be improbable. <i>A <b>farfetched</b> excuse.</i>
<b>implausible</b>	Highly imaginative but unlikely. <i>Gave the teacher an <b>implausible</b> excuse.</i>
<a href="#">impossible</a>	Not able to occur, exist, or be done. <i>What an arrogant <b>impossible</b> fool.</i>
<b>improbable</b>	Too improbable to admit of belief. <i>This account of events was seen by the jury as most <b>improbable</b>.</i>
<a href="#">inconceivable</a>	Not capable of being imagined or grasped mentally; unbelievable. <i>They behaved with <b>inconceivable</b> cruelty.</i>

<b>incredible</b>	Beyond belief or understanding. <i>The noise from the crowd was <b>incredible</b>.</i>
<b><u>marvelous</u></b>	Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. <i>A <b>marvelous</b> collection of rare books.</i>
<b><u>miraculous</u></b>	Remarkable and bringing very welcome consequences. <i>A <b>miraculous</b> cure.</i>
<b>miraculously</b>	In a miraculous manner. <i>The two drivers <b>miraculously</b> escaped with only minor injuries.</i>
<b>profound</b>	Profound quality. <i>The <b>profound</b> depths of the sea.</i>
<b>redoubtable</b>	(of a person) formidable, especially as an opponent. <i>Born of a <b>redoubtable</b> family.</i>
<b><u>staggering</u></b>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>Suffered a <b>staggering</b> defeat.</i>
<b><u>supposed</u></b>	Required or under orders. <i>I m <b>supposed</b> to be there at ten.</i>
<b>unbelief</b>	Lack of religious belief; an absence of faith. <i>The darkness of <b>unbelief</b>.</i>
<b><u>unconvincing</u></b>	Not convincing. <i>A slightly bizarre and <b>unconvincing</b> fusion of musical forces.</i>
<b><u>unfaithful</u></b>	Disloyal, treacherous, or insincere. <i>An <b>unfaithful</b> reproduction.</i>
<b>unimaginable</b>	Difficult or impossible to imagine or comprehend. <i>Lives of almost <b>unimaginable</b> deprivation.</i>
<b><u>unlikely</u></b>	Having a probability too low to inspire belief. <i>Legislation on the question is highly <b>unlikely</b>.</i>
<b>unreliable</b>	Lacking a sense of responsibility. <i>He s lazy and <b>unreliable</b>.</i>
<b><u>unthinkable</u></b>	Incapable of being conceived or considered. <i>The <b>unthinkable</b> happened I spoke up.</i>
<b>untrustworthy</b>	Not able to be relied on as honest or truthful. <i>These <b>untrustworthy</b> impressions were instinctive.</i>
<b>wonderful</b>	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>The climate was <b>wonderful</b> all the year round.</i>
