amaze	Affect with wonder. <i>Your ability to speak six languages amazes me.</i>
astonish	Surprise or impress (someone) greatly. <i>It astonished her that he was so anxious.</i>
astonishing	Extremely surprising or impressive; amazing. <i>Such an enormous response was astonishing.</i>
astound	Affect with wonder. <i>Her bluntness astounded him.</i>
astounding	Surprisingly impressive or notable. <i>An astounding achievement.</i>
disbelief	Doubt about the truth of something. <i>I ll burn in hell for disbelief.</i>
doubtful	Open to doubt or suspicion. <i>He looked doubtful but gave a nod.</i>
fabulous	Having no basis in reality; mythical. <i>Fabulous riches.</i>
farfetched	(of an idea or story) so exaggerated or ludicrous as to be improbable. <i>A farfetched excuse.</i>
implausible	Highly imaginative but unlikely. <i>Gave the teacher an implausible excuse.</i>
impossible	Not able to occur, exist, or be done. <i>What an arrogant impossible fool.</i>
improbable	Too improbable to admit of belief. <i>This account of events was seen by the jury as most improbable.</i>
inconceivable	Not capable of being imagined or grasped mentally; unbelievable. <i>They behaved with inconceivable cruelty.</i>

incredible	Beyond belief or understanding. <i>The noise from the crowd was incredible.</i>
marvelous	Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. <i>A marvelous collection of rare books.</i>
miraculous	Remarkable and bringing very welcome consequences. <i>A miraculous cure.</i>
miraculously	In a miraculous manner. <i>The two drivers miraculously escaped with only minor injuries.</i>
profound	Profound quality. <i>The profound depths of the sea.</i>
redoubtable	(of a person) formidable, especially as an opponent. <i>Born of a redoubtable family.</i>
staggering	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>Suffered a staggering defeat.</i>
supposed	Required or under orders. <i>I m supposed to be there at ten.</i>
unbelief	Lack of religious belief; an absence of faith. <i>The darkness of unbelief.</i>
unconvincing	Not convincing. <i>A slightly bizarre and unconvincing fusion of musical forces.</i>
unfaithful	Disloyal, treacherous, or insincere. <i>An unfaithful reproduction.</i>
unimaginable	Difficult or impossible to imagine or comprehend. <i>Lives of almost unimaginable deprivation.</i>
unlikely	Having a probability too low to inspire belief. <i>Legislation on the question is highly unlikely.</i>
unreliable	Lacking a sense of responsibility. <i>He s lazy and unreliable.</i>
unthinkable	Incapable of being conceived or considered. <i>The unthinkable happened I spoke up.</i>
untrustworthy	Not able to be relied on as honest or truthful. <i>These untrustworthy impressions were instinctive.</i>
wonderful	Extraordinarily good or great ; used especially as intensifiers. <i>The climate was wonderful all the year round.</i>
