incredible Beyond belief or understanding.

The noise from the crowd was **incredible**.

marvelous Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers.

A **marvelous** collection of rare books.

miraculous Remarkable and bringing very welcome consequences.

A **miraculous** cure.

miraculously In a miraculous manner.

The two drivers **miraculously** escaped with only minor injuries.

profound Profound quality.

The **profound** depths of the sea.

redoubtable (of a person) formidable, especially as an opponent.
