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## Associations of "For uniform" (30 Words)

<b>apparel</b>	Provide with clothes or put clothes on. <i>They were dressed in bright <b>apparel</b>.</i>
<b><u>boot</u></b>	Kick give a boot to. <i>When I <b>booted</b> the computer I heard a extremely loud rattle.</i>
<b>brogan</b>	A coarse stout leather shoe reaching to the ankle.
<b>brogue</b>	A thick and heavy shoe.
<b>clad</b>	Covered with cladding. <i>Leather <b>clad</b> boys.</i>
<b>clothed</b>	Wearing or provided with clothing; sometimes used in combination- Bible. <i>A partially <b>clothed</b> body.</i>
<b>clothes</b>	Bedclothes. <i>Baby <b>clothes</b>.</i>
<b>clothing</b>	Clothes collectively. <i>Bring warm <b>clothing</b> and waterproofs.</i>
<b>corset</b>	Dress with a corset.
<b><u>dress</u></b>	Clean treat or apply a dressing to a wound. <i>After you <b>dress</b> a dry fly be sure to remove any oil before you make your next cast.</i>
<b><u>dressed</u></b>	Dressed in fancy or formal clothing. <i><b>Dressed</b> crab.</i>
<b>footwear</b>	Clothing worn on a person’s feet.
<b>gown</b>	Put on a surgical gown. <i>The lab is supposed to be sterile so you have to <b>gown</b> up.</i>
<b>hosiery</b>	Stockings, socks, and tights collectively.
<b>hussar</b>	A soldier in a light cavalry regiment which had adopted a dress uniform modelled on that of the Hungarian hussars now only in titles. <i>The Queen's Royal Irish <b>Hussars</b>.</i>

<b>invariable</b>	(of a quantity) constant. <i>His <b>invariable</b> courtesy.</i>
<b>jean</b>	A coarse durable twill-weave cotton fabric. <i>A <b>jean</b> jacket.</i>
<b>legging</b>	A garment covering the leg (usually extending from the knee to the ankle).
<b>outfit</b>	A set of clothes worn together, especially for a particular occasion or purpose. <i>Warders <b>outfitted</b> in special suits.</i>
<b>pants</b>	Underpants worn by women. <i>Corduroy <b>pants</b>.</i>
<b>robe</b>	Clothe formally especially in ecclesiastical robes. <i>He was dressed in his archbishop s <b>robes</b> after some function.</i>
<b>sandal</b>	A shoe consisting of a sole fastened by straps to the foot. <i>They were dressed in open toed <b>sandals</b>.</i>
<b>shoes</b>	A particular situation.
<b>skimpy</b>	Providing or consisting of less than is needed; meagre. <i>A <b>skimpy</b> allowance.</i>
<b>swimsuit</b>	A woman's one-piece swimming costume.
<b>undergarment</b>	A garment worn under other garments.
<b>underwear</b>	Undergarment worn next to the skin and under the outer garments.
<b>uniformed</b>	Wearing a uniform. <i><b>Uniformed</b> police officers.</i>
<b>vestment</b>	Gown (especially ceremonial garments) worn by the clergy. <i>A priest in green <b>vestments</b> came and preached a long sermon.</i>
<b>wear</b>	The wearing of something or the state of being worn as clothing. <i>He always <b>wears</b> a smile.</i>
