Associations of "For win" (30 Words)

accomplishment	Something that has been achieved successfully. <i>A poet of considerable accomplishment.</i>
achieve	Successfully bring about or reach (a desired objective or result) by effort, skill, or courage. <i>People striving to achieve.</i>
achievement	The action of accomplishing something. <i>A sense of achievement.</i>
achiever	A person who achieves a high or specified level of success. <i>His son would never be the achiever that his father was.</i>
acquirement	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>The acquirement of self control.</i>
acquisition	The learning or developing of a skill, habit, or quality. <i>Western culture places a high value on material acquisition.</i>
attain	Reach a destination, either real or abstract. <i>Clarify your objectives and ways of attaining them.</i>
attainment	A thing achieved, especially a skill or educational achievement. <i>The attainment of corporate aims.</i>
blowout	A sudden malfunction of a part or apparatus. <i>The local store is having a big blowout sale everything 65 per cent off.</i>
clinch	Fasten a rope or angling line with a clinch knot. <i>The nails were clinched.</i>
competition	An event or contest in which people take part in order to establish superiority or supremacy in a particular area. <i>I walked round to check out the competition.</i>
competitive	Involving competition or competitiveness. <i>A competitive sport.</i>

<u>contention</u>	A point asserted as part of an argument. <i>The captured territory was the main area of contention between the two countries.</i>
<u>contest</u>	An occasion on which a winner is selected from among two or more contestants. <i>A coalition was formed to contest the presidential elections.</i>
gain	Derive a benefit from. <i>An amplifier of high gain.</i>
gamely	In a brave, spirited way. <i>He battled gamely but was outclassed by his more experienced opponent.</i>
jubilant	Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. <i>A large number of jubilant fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
jubilation	A feeling of great happiness and triumph. <i>Unbelievable scenes of jubilation.</i>
opposing	Facing; opposite. <i>The brothers fought on opposing sides in the war.</i>
outmaneuver	Defeat by more skillful maneuvering. <i>The English troops outmaneuvered the Germans.</i>
rejoicing	Great joy; jubilation. <i>The ban was lifted in 1990 amid general rejoicing.</i>
<u>rivalry</u>	Competition for the same objective or for superiority in the same field. <i>There always has been intense rivalry between the clubs.</i>
succeed	Come after and take the place of. <i>It was a mission that could not possibly succeed.</i>
success	An attainment that is successful. <i>If you want to be a success you have to dress like a success.</i>
<u>triumph</u>	(of a Roman general) ride into ancient Rome after a victory. <i>Here it is Helen's voice rose in triumph.</i>
<u>triumphant</u>	Experiencing triumph. <i>A triumphant shout.</i>
<u>trophy</u>	(in ancient Greece or Rome) the weapons of a defeated army set up as a memorial of victory.
victor	A combatant who is able to defeat rivals. <i>Congratulations to the victors.</i>
<u>victory</u>	A successful ending of a struggle or contest. <i>An election victory.</i>

A goal or shot that wins a match or point.
Only **winners** need apply.
