## Associations of "For win" (30 Words)

accomplishment	Something that has been achieved successfully. A poet of considerable <b>accomplishment</b> .
achieve	Successfully bring about or reach (a desired objective or result) by effort, skill, or courage. <i>People striving to <b>achieve</b></i> .
achievement	The action of accomplishing something. A sense of <b>achievement</b> .
achiever	A person who achieves a high or specified level of success. <i>His son would never be the <b>achiever</b> that his father was.</i>
acquirement	An ability that has been acquired by training. The <b>acquirement</b> of self control.
acquisition	The learning or developing of a skill, habit, or quality. Western culture places a high value on material <b>acquisition</b> .
<u>attain</u>	Reach a destination, either real or abstract. Clarify your objectives and ways of <b>attain</b> ing them.
<u>attainment</u>	A thing achieved, especially a skill or educational achievement. <i>The <b>attainment</b> of corporate aims.</i>
blowout	A sudden malfunction of a part or apparatus. The local store is having a big <b>blowout</b> sale everything 65 per cent off.
clinch	Fasten a rope or angling line with a clinch knot. The nails were <b>clinch</b> ed.
competition	An event or contest in which people take part in order to establish superiority or supremacy in a particular area. <i>I walked round to check out the <b>competition</b>.</i>
competitive	Involving competition or competitiveness. A <b>competitive</b> sport.



<u>contention</u>	A point asserted as part of an argument. The captured territory was the main area of <b>contention</b> between the two countries.
<u>contest</u>	An occasion on which a winner is selected from among two or more contestants. A coalition was formed to <b>contest</b> the presidential elections.
gain	Derive a benefit from. An amplifier of high <b>gain</b> .
gamely	In a brave, spirited way. <i>He battled <b>gamely</b> but was outclassed by his more experienced opponent.</i>
jubilant	Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.
jubilation	A feeling of great happiness and triumph. Unbelievable scenes of <b>jubilation</b> .
opposing	Facing; opposite. The brothers fought on <b>opposing</b> sides in the war.
outmaneuver	Defeat by more skillful maneuvering. The English troops <b>outmaneuver</b> ed the Germans.
rejoicing	Great joy; jubilation. The ban was lifted in 1990 amid general <b>rejoicing</b> .
<u>rivalry</u>	Competition for the same objective or for superiority in the same field. <i>There always has been intense</i> <b>rivalry</b> <i>between the clubs.</i>
succeed	Come after and take the place of. It was a mission that could not possibly <b>succeed</b> .
success	An attainment that is successful. If you want to be a <b>success</b> you have to dress like a <b>success</b> .
<u>triumph</u>	(of a Roman general) ride into ancient Rome after a victory. <i>Here it is Helen s voice rose in <b>triumph</b>.</i>
<u>triumphant</u>	Experiencing triumph. A <b>triumphant</b> shout.
<u>trophy</u>	(in ancient Greece or Rome) the weapons of a defeated army set up as a memorial of victory.
victor	A combatant who is able to defeat rivals. <i>Congratulations to the victors</i> .
victory	A successful ending of a struggle or contest. An election <b>victory</b> .
