## Associations of "For win" (30 Words)

<b>accomplishment</b>	Something that has been achieved successfully. <i>A poet of considerable <b>accomplishment</b>.</i>
<b>achieve</b>	Successfully bring about or reach (a desired objective or result) by effort, skill, or courage. <i>People striving to <b>achieve</b>.</i>
<b>achievement</b>	The action of accomplishing something. <i>A sense of <b>achievement</b>.</i>
<b>achiever</b>	A person who achieves a high or specified level of success. <i>His son would never be the <b>achiever</b> that his father was.</i>
<b>acquirement</b>	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>The <b>acquirement</b> of self control.</i>
<b>acquisition</b>	The learning or developing of a skill, habit, or quality. <i>Western culture places a high value on material <b>acquisition</b>.</i>
<a href="#">attain</a>	Reach a destination, either real or abstract. <i>Clarify your objectives and ways of <b>attaining</b> them.</i>
<a href="#">attainment</a>	A thing achieved, especially a skill or educational achievement. <i>The <b>attainment</b> of corporate aims.</i>
<b>blowout</b>	A sudden malfunction of a part or apparatus. <i>The local store is having a big <b>blowout</b> sale everything 65 per cent off.</i>
<b>clinch</b>	Fasten a rope or angling line with a clinch knot. <i>The nails were <b>clinched</b>.</i>
<b>competition</b>	An event or contest in which people take part in order to establish superiority or supremacy in a particular area. <i>I walked round to check out the <b>competition</b>.</i>
<b>competitive</b>	Involving competition or competitiveness. <i>A <b>competitive</b> sport.</i>

<b><u>contention</u></b>	A point asserted as part of an argument. <i>The captured territory was the main area of <b>contention</b> between the two countries.</i>
<b><u>contest</u></b>	An occasion on which a winner is selected from among two or more contestants. <i>A coalition was formed to <b>contest</b> the presidential elections.</i>
<b>gain</b>	Derive a benefit from. <i>An amplifier of high <b>gain</b>.</i>
<b>gamely</b>	In a brave, spirited way. <i>He battled <b>gamely</b> but was outclassed by his more experienced opponent.</i>
<b>jubilant</b>	Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. <i>A large number of <b>jubilant</b> fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
<b>jubilation</b>	A feeling of great happiness and triumph. <i>Unbelievable scenes of <b>jubilation</b>.</i>
<b>opposing</b>	Facing; opposite. <i>The brothers fought on <b>opposing</b> sides in the war.</i>
<b>outmaneuver</b>	Defeat by more skillful maneuvering. <i>The English troops <b>outmaneuvered</b> the Germans.</i>
<b>rejoicing</b>	Great joy; jubilation. <i>The ban was lifted in 1990 amid general <b>rejoicing</b>.</i>
<b><u>rivalry</u></b>	Competition for the same objective or for superiority in the same field. <i>There always has been intense <b>rivalry</b> between the clubs.</i>
<b>succeed</b>	Come after and take the place of. <i>It was a mission that could not possibly <b>succeed</b>.</i>
<b>success</b>	An attainment that is successful. <i>If you want to be a <b>success</b> you have to dress like a <b>success</b>.</i>
<b><u>triumph</u></b>	(of a Roman general) ride into ancient Rome after a victory. <i>Here it is Helen's voice rose in <b>triumph</b>.</i>
<b><u>triumphant</u></b>	Experiencing triumph. <i>A <b>triumphant</b> shout.</i>
<b><u>trophy</u></b>	(in ancient Greece or Rome) the weapons of a defeated army set up as a memorial of victory.
<b>victor</b>	A combatant who is able to defeat rivals. <i>Congratulations to the <b>victors</b>.</i>
<b><u>victory</u></b>	A successful ending of a struggle or contest. <i>An election <b>victory</b>.</i>
