<a href="#">accomplish</a>	Put in effect. <i>Once this form has been <b>accomplished</b> the applicant needs to secure supporting documents.</i>
<b>assiduity</b>	Constant or close attention to what one is doing. <i>The <b>assiduity</b> with which he could wear down his opponents.</i>
<a href="#">assiduous</a>	Showing great care and perseverance. <i>She was <b>assiduous</b> in pointing out every feature.</i>
<a href="#">chore</a>	A routine task, especially a household one. <i>He sees interviews as a <b>chore</b>.</i>
<b>collaborate</b>	Cooperate traitorously with an enemy. <i>During the last war they <b>collaborated</b> with the Nazis.</i>
<a href="#">cooperatively</a>	In close cooperation. <i>A <b>cooperatively</b> owned restaurant.</i>
<b>diligent</b>	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>A <b>diligent</b> detective investigates all clues.</i>
<b>employed</b>	Having your services engaged for; or having a job especially one that pays wages or a salary. <i>Most of our graduates are <b>employed</b>.</i>
<b>employment</b>	The action of giving work to someone. <i>A fall in the numbers in full time <b>employment</b>.</i>
<a href="#">engaged</a>	Having ones attention or mind or energy engaged. <i>The gears are <b>engaged</b>.</i>
<b>hired</b>	Hired for the exclusive temporary use of a group of travelers. <i>A <b>hired</b> assassin.</i>
<a href="#">interact</a>	Act together or towards others or with others. <i>He should <b>interact</b> more with his colleagues.</i>

<b>job</b>	A workplace as in the expression on the job. <i>The barber did a real <b>job</b> on my hair.</i>
<b>labor</b>	A social class comprising those who do manual labor or work for wages. <i>His <b>labor</b> did not require a great deal of skill.</i>
<b>menial</b>	A person with a menial job. <i><b>Menial</b> factory jobs.</i>
<b>overtime</b>	Payment for overtime. <i>They lost in <b>overtime</b>.</i>
<b>partnership</b>	A contract between two or more persons who agree to pool talent and money and share profits or losses. <i>The action teams worked in <b>partnership</b> with the government.</i>
<b>proletariat</b>	A social class comprising those who do manual labor or work for wages. <i>The growth of the industrial <b>proletariat</b>.</i>
<b>reconstruction</b>	An impression, model, or re-enactment of a past event formed from the available evidence. <i>The economic <b>reconstruction</b> of Russia.</i>
<b>recruiter</b>	A person whose job is to enlist or enrol people as employees, in the armed forces, or as members of an organization. <i>A <b>recruiter</b> will schedule you for an interview.</i>
<b>recruitment</b>	The act of getting recruits; enlisting people for the army (or for a job or a cause etc). <i>The black tailed deer is notoriously capable of population <b>recruitment</b> after numbers are depleted.</i>
<b>scullion</b>	A kitchen servant employed to do menial tasks (especially washing).
<b>semiskilled</b>	Possessing or requiring limited skills. <i>A <b>semiskilled</b> job.</i>
<b>subcontract</b>	Work under a subcontract engage in a subcontract. <i><b>Subcontract</b> work.</i>
<b>successfully</b>	In a way that accomplishes a desired aim or result. <i>She has <b>successfully</b> completed her mission.</i>
<b>task</b>	Assign a task to. <i>The endless <b>task</b> of classifying the samples.</i>
<b>toil</b>	Exhausting physical labour. <i>A life of <b>toil</b>.</i>
<b>travail</b>	Use of physical or mental energy; hard work. <i>A woman in <b>travail</b>.</i>

**working**

Actively engaged in paid work.
