accomplish	Put in effect. <i>Once this form has been accomplished the applicant needs to secure supporting documents.</i>
assiduity	Constant or close attention to what one is doing. <i>The assiduity with which he could wear down his opponents.</i>
assiduous	Showing great care and perseverance. <i>She was assiduous in pointing out every feature.</i>
chore	A routine task, especially a household one. <i>He sees interviews as a chore.</i>
collaborate	Cooperate traitorously with an enemy. <i>During the last war they collaborated with the Nazis.</i>
cooperatively	In close cooperation. <i>A cooperatively owned restaurant.</i>
diligent	Quietly and steadily persevering especially in detail or exactness. <i>A diligent detective investigates all clues.</i>
employed	Having your services engaged for; or having a job especially one that pays wages or a salary. <i>Most of our graduates are employed.</i>
employment	The action of giving work to someone. <i>A fall in the numbers in full time employment.</i>
engaged	Having ones attention or mind or energy engaged. <i>The gears are engaged.</i>
hired	Hired for the exclusive temporary use of a group of travelers. <i>A hired assassin.</i>
interact	Act together or towards others or with others. <i>He should interact more with his colleagues.</i>

job	A workplace as in the expression on the job. <i>The barber did a real job on my hair.</i>
labor	A social class comprising those who do manual labor or work for wages. <i>His labor did not require a great deal of skill.</i>
menial	A person with a menial job. <i>Menial factory jobs.</i>
overtime	Payment for overtime. <i>They lost in overtime.</i>
partnership	A contract between two or more persons who agree to pool talent and money and share profits or losses. <i>The action teams worked in partnership with the government.</i>
proletariat	A social class comprising those who do manual labor or work for wages. <i>The growth of the industrial proletariat.</i>
reconstruction	An impression, model, or re-enactment of a past event formed from the available evidence. <i>The economic reconstruction of Russia.</i>
recruiter	A person whose job is to enlist or enrol people as employees, in the armed forces, or as members of an organization. <i>A recruiter will schedule you for an interview.</i>
recruitment	The act of getting recruits; enlisting people for the army (or for a job or a cause etc). <i>The black tailed deer is notoriously capable of population recruitment after numbers are depleted.</i>
scullion	A kitchen servant employed to do menial tasks (especially washing).
semiskilled	Possessing or requiring limited skills. <i>A semiskilled job.</i>
subcontract	Work under a subcontract engage in a subcontract. <i>Subcontract work.</i>
successfully	In a way that accomplishes a desired aim or result. <i>She has successfully completed her mission.</i>
task	Assign a task to. <i>The endless task of classifying the samples.</i>
toil	Exhausting physical labour. <i>A life of toil.</i>
travail	Use of physical or mental energy; hard work. <i>A woman in travail.</i>

Not having or requiring special skill or training.
Unskilled in the art of rhetoric.

working

Actively engaged in paid work.
