- Of concern to or concerning the affairs of other nations (other than your own.
- Of, from, in, or characteristic of a country or language other than one's own.
- Coming or introduced from outside.
- Not belonging to that in which it is contained; introduced from an outside source.
- Not belonging to or characteristic of.
- Of or belonging to another district or area.
- Not contained in or deriving from the essential nature of something.
- Dealing with or relating to other countries.
- Strange and unfamiliar.
