Associations of "Foresaw" (30 Words)

anticipate	Regard something as probable or likely. <i>This is to anticipate the argument.</i>
anticipation	The act of predicting (as by reasoning about the future). <i>Her eyes sparkled with anticipation.</i>
<u>anticipatory</u>	(of a breach of contract) taking the form of an announcement or indication that a contract will not be honoured. <i>An anticipatory flash of excitement.</i>
<u>assume</u>	Take on a certain form, attribute, or aspect. <i>This is the day when Mary was assumed into heaven.</i>
assumption	Audacious (even arrogant) behavior that you have no right to. <i>On the assumption that he has been injured we can infer that he will not play.</i>
believe	Follow a credo have a faith be a believer. <i>There are those on the fringes of the Church who do not really believe.</i>
bode	Indicate, as with a sign or an omen. <i>The 12 per cent interest rate bodes dark days ahead for retailers.</i>
<u>expect</u>	Consider obligatory request and expect. <i>The are expecting another child in January.</i>
expectancy	Something expected (as on the basis of a norm). <i>An indicator of expectancy in development.</i>
expectation	The sum of the values of a random variable divided by the number of values. <i>Reality had not lived up to expectations.</i>
forebode	Have a presentiment of (something bad). <i>This lull foreboded some new assault upon him.</i>
forecast	Indicate, as with a sign or an omen. <i>Coal consumption in Europe is forecast to increase.</i>

forecasting	A statement made about the future.
foreshadow	Be a warning or indication of (a future event). <i>Other new measures are foreshadowed in the White Paper.</i>
foretell	Make a prediction about; tell in advance. <i>A seer had foretold that the earl would assume the throne.</i>
guess	Guess correctly solve by guessing. <i>We can only guess at Alan s motives.</i>
guesswork	An estimate based on little or no information. <i>Answering this question will involve you in a certain amount of guesswork.</i>
preconception	A preconceived idea or prejudice. <i>He did not even try to confirm his preconceptions.</i>
predict	Make a prediction about tell in advance. <i>He predicts that the trend will continue.</i>
prediction	The action of predicting something. <i>The prediction of future behaviour.</i>
presage	(of a person) predict. <i>The heavy clouds above the moorland presaged snow.</i>
presume	Suppose that something is the case on the basis of probability. <i>Forgive me if I have presumed.</i>
presuppose	Require as a necessary antecedent or precondition. <i>Their original prediction presupposed a universe only three billion years old.</i>
prognosticate	Foretell or prophesy (a future event). <i>The economists were prognosticating financial Armageddon.</i>
prognostication	A prophecy. <i>These gloomy prognostications proved to be unfounded.</i>
prophecy	A prediction of what will happen in the future. <i>The gift of prophecy.</i>
prophesy	Say that (a specified thing) will happen in the future. <i>Jacques was prophesying a bumper harvest.</i>
soothsayer	A person supposed to be able to foresee the future.
speculation	A hypothesis that has been formed by speculating or conjecturing (usually with little hard evidence). <i>This is pure speculation on my part.</i>

supposition

A belief held without proof or certain knowledge; an assumption or hypothesis.

*Their outrage was based on **supposition** and hearsay.*
