| <b>anticipate</b>          | Regard something as probable or likely.<br><i>This is to <b>anticipate</b> the argument.</i>   |
| <b>anticipation</b>        | The act of predicting (as by reasoning about the future).<br><i>Her eyes sparkled with <b>anticipation</b>.</i>  |
| <b><u>anticipatory</u></b> | (of a breach of contract) taking the form of an announcement or indication that a contract will not be honoured.<br><i>An <b>anticipatory</b> flash of excitement.</i> |
| <b><u>assume</u></b>       | Take on a certain form, attribute, or aspect.<br><i>This is the day when Mary was <b>assumed</b> into heaven.</i>  |
| <b>assumption</b>          | Audacious (even arrogant) behavior that you have no right to.<br><i>On the <b>assumption</b> that he has been injured we can infer that he will not play.</i>          |
| <b>believe</b>             | Follow a credo have a faith be a believer.<br><i>There are those on the fringes of the Church who do not really <b>believe</b>.</i>                                    |
| <b>bode</b>                | Indicate, as with a sign or an omen.<br><i>The 12 per cent interest rate <b>bodes</b> dark days ahead for retailers.</i>   |
| <b><u>expect</u></b>       | Consider obligatory request and expect.<br><i>The are <b>expecting</b> another child in January.</i>   |
| <b>expectancy</b>          | Something expected (as on the basis of a norm).<br><i>An indicator of <b>expectancy</b> in development.</i>  |
| <b>expectation</b>         | The sum of the values of a random variable divided by the number of values.<br><i>Reality had not lived up to <b>expectations</b>.</i>                                 |
| <b>forebode</b>            | Have a presentiment of (something bad).<br><i>This lull <b>foreboded</b> some new assault upon him.</i>  |
| <b>forecast</b>            | Indicate, as with a sign or an omen.<br><i>Coal consumption in Europe is <b>forecast</b> to increase.</i>  |

| <b>forecasting</b>     | A statement made about the future.  |
| <b>foreshadow</b>      | Be a warning or indication of (a future event).<br><i>Other new measures are <b>foreshadowed</b> in the White Paper.</i>                                    |
| <b>foretell</b>        | Make a prediction about; tell in advance.<br><i>A seer had foretold that the earl would assume the throne.</i>  |
| <b>guess</b>           | Guess correctly solve by guessing.<br><i>We can only <b>guess</b> at Alan s motives.</i>  |
| <b>guesswork</b>       | An estimate based on little or no information.<br><i>Answering this question will involve you in a certain amount of <b>guesswork</b>.</i>                  |
| <b>preconception</b>   | A preconceived idea or prejudice.<br><i>He did not even try to confirm his <b>preconceptions</b>.</i>   |
| <b>predict</b>         | Make a prediction about tell in advance.<br><i>He <b>predicts</b> that the trend will continue.</i>   |
| <b>prediction</b>      | The action of predicting something.<br><i>The <b>prediction</b> of future behaviour.</i>  |
| <b>presage</b>         | (of a person) predict.<br><i>The heavy clouds above the moorland <b>presaged</b> snow.</i>  |
| <b>presume</b>         | Suppose that something is the case on the basis of probability.<br><i>Forgive me if I have <b>presumed</b>.</i>   |
| <b>presuppose</b>      | Require as a necessary antecedent or precondition.<br><i>Their original prediction <b>presupposed</b> a universe only three billion years old.</i>          |
| <b>prognosticate</b>   | Foretell or prophesy (a future event).<br><i>The economists were prognosticating financial Armageddon.</i>  |
| <b>prognostication</b> | A prophecy.<br><i>These gloomy <b>prognostications</b> proved to be unfounded.</i>  |
| <b>prophecy</b>        | A prediction of what will happen in the future.<br><i>The gift of <b>prophecy</b>.</i>  |
| <b>prophesy</b>        | Say that (a specified thing) will happen in the future.<br><i>Jacques was <b>prophesying</b> a bumper harvest.</i>  |
| <b>soothsayer</b>      | A person supposed to be able to foresee the future.   |
| <b>speculation</b>     | A hypothesis that has been formed by speculating or conjecturing (usually with little hard evidence).<br><i>This is pure <b>speculation</b> on my part.</i> |

**supposition**

A belief held without proof or certain knowledge; an assumption or hypothesis.

*Their outrage was based on **supposition** and hearsay.*
