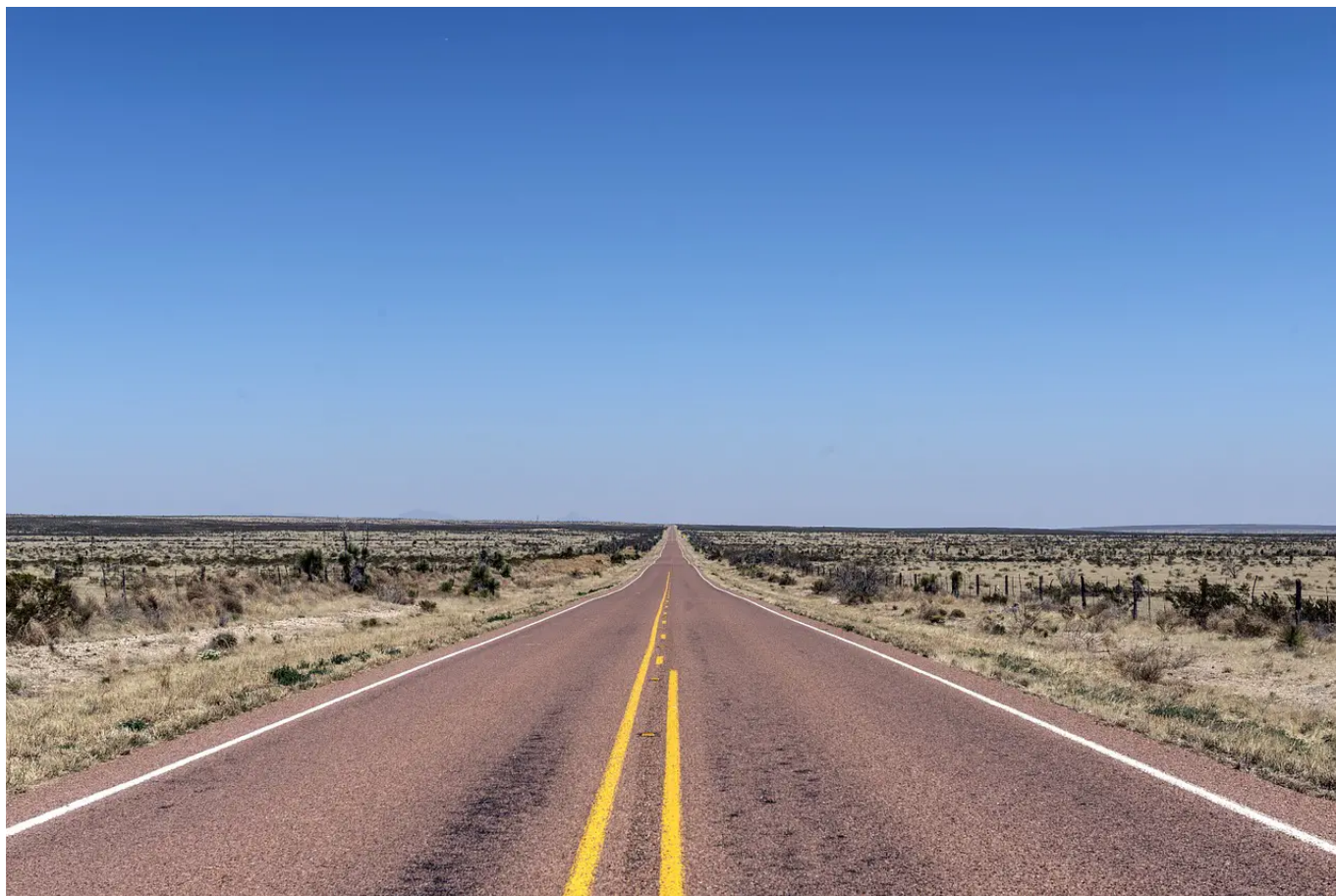

## Forever as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Forever" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “forever” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *For all future time; for always.*
- *Without interruption.*
- *For a limitless time- P.P.Bliss.*
- *Continually.*
- *For a very long or seemingly endless time.*
- *For a limitless time.*
- *A very long time (used hyperbolically).*
- *Used in slogans of support after the name of something or someone.*



## Synonyms of "Forever" as an adverb (23 Words)

<b>always</b>	Repeatedly and annoyingly. <i>She will <b>always</b> be missed.</i>
<b>constantly</b>	Continuously over a period of time; always. <i>The world is <b>constantly</b> changing.</i>
<u><a href="#">continually</a></u>	Seemingly without interruption. <i>I was <b>continually</b> moving around.</i>
<b>continuously</b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>These images loop <b>continuously</b>.</i>
<u><a href="#">endlessly</a></u>	Without bounds. <i>The original episodes were <b>endlessly</b> repeated.</i>
<u><a href="#">eternally</a></u>	Used to emphasize expressions of admiration, gratitude, etc. <i>His <b>eternally</b> optimistic attitude.</i>
<b>everlastingly</b>	For a limitless time.

<b>evermore</b>	For a limitless time- P.P.Bliss. <i>We pray that we may <b>evermore</b> dwell in him and he in us.</i>
<b>for all time</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’.
<b>for always</b>	Forever; throughout all time.
<b>for ever</b>	At any time.
<b>for ever and ever</b>	At any time.
<b>for good</b>	Completely and absolutely (‘good’ is sometimes used informally for ‘thoroughly’.
<b>for good and all</b>	Completely and absolutely (‘good’ is sometimes used informally for ‘thoroughly’.
<b>forever and a day</b>	For a very long or seemingly endless time.
<b>in perpetuity</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>incessantly</b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>once and for all</b>	At a previous time.
<b>permanently</b>	For a long time without essential change. <i>His lungs are <b>permanently</b> damaged.</i>
<b>perpetually</b>	In a way that never ends or changes; constantly. <i>She seems <b>perpetually</b> to have a mournful look on her face.</i>
<b>persistently</b>	In a persistent manner; continuously. <i>The rules are <b>persistently</b> flouted.</i>
<b><u>regularly</u></b>	On a habitual basis; usually. <i>Make a point of <b>regularly</b> consulting the noticeboard.</i>
<b>repeatedly</b>	Several time. <i>They have been warned <b>repeatedly</b> with no effect.</i>



### Usage Examples of "Forever" as an adverb

- *No one can live forever.*
- *We had to wait forever and a day.*
- *She would love him forever.*
- *She took forever to write the paper.*
- *Scotland Forever!*
- *It took forever to get a passport.*

<b>ceaseless</b>	Constant and unending. <i>The <b>ceaseless</b> thunder of surf.</i>
<b>changeless</b>	Remaining the same for indefinitely long times. <i><b>Changeless</b> truths.</i>
<b>constantly</b>	Without interruption. <i><b>Constantly</b> kind and gracious.</i>
<b>continually</b>	Without interruption; constantly. <i>I was <b>continually</b> moving around.</i>
<b>continuously</b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>These images loop <b>continuously</b>.</i>

<b>endless</b>	Countless; innumerable. <i><b>Endless</b> loop cassette tapes.</i>
<b><u>endlessly</u></b>	With unflagging resolve. <i>The original episodes were <b>endlessly</b> repeated.</i>
<b><u>eternal</u></b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>She is an <b>eternal</b> optimist.</i>
<b>eternity</b>	A state to which time has no application; timelessness. <i>This state of affairs has lasted for all <b>eternity</b>.</i>
<b><u>ever</u></b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Caravan holidays remain as popular as <b>ever</b>.</i>
<b>everlasting</b>	Continuing forever or indefinitely. <i>An <b>everlasting</b> reminder of this evening.</i>
<b><u>every</u></b>	Each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception. <i>Had <b>every</b> hope of success.</i>
<b><u>grinding</u></b>	A harsh and strident sound as of the grinding of gears. <i>Crush it and add it to the honey with a <b>grinding</b> of pepper and salt.</i>
<b>immortality</b>	The ability to live forever; eternal life. <i>Eating the fruit gave the gods <b>immortality</b>.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>The <b>incessant</b> beat of the music.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>indefinite</b>	Not decided or not known. <i>Plans are <b>indefinite</b>.</i>
<b><u>infinite</u></b>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>He bathed the wound with <b>infinite</b> care.</i>
<b><u>infinity</u></b>	An infinite or very great number or amount. <i>The lawns stretched into <b>infinity</b>.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>An <b>interminable</b> sermon.</i>
<b>permanence</b>	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration. <i>The clarity and <b>permanence</b> of the dyes.</i>
<b>permanency</b>	The property of being able to exist for an indefinite duration.
<b><u>permanent</u></b>	A perm for the hair. <i><b>Permanent</b> address.</i>

<b>perpetual</b>	(of an investment) having no fixed maturity date; irredeemable. <i>A <b>perpetual</b> secretary of the society.</i>
<b>perpetually</b>	Without interruption. <i>She seems <b>perpetually</b> to have a mournful look on her face.</i>
<b>perpetuity</b>	The property of being perpetual (seemingly ceaseless). <i>He did not believe in the <b>perpetuity</b> of military rule.</i>
<b>unceasing</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Man's <b>unceasing</b> warfare with drought and isolation.</i>
<b>unceasingly</b>	With unflagging resolve.
<b>undying</b>	Never dying. <i>His <b>undying</b> fame.</i>
<b>unlimited</b>	Not limited or restricted in terms of number, quantity, or extent. <i>To start with a theory of <b>unlimited</b> freedom is to end up with <b>unlimited</b> despotism.</i>
