- *Make or shape (a metal object) by heating it in a fire or furnace and hammering it.*
- *Move ahead steadily.*
- *Make a copy of with the intent to deceive.*

mould

Form (an object) out of malleable material.
***Mould** the figure from white fondant.*

put together

Formulate in a particular style or language.

replicate

(of genetic material or a living organism) reproduce or give rise to a copy of itself.

*In order to **replicate** cells must make copies of their DNA.*

reproduce

(of an organism) produce offspring by a sexual or asexual process.
*These bacteria **reproduce**.*

set up

Urge to attack someone.

shape

Give a particular shape or form to.
*I had plenty of time and **shaped** to kick to the near touchline.*

simulate

Pretend to have or feel (an emotion).
*Red ochre intended to **simulate** blood.*

spirt

Gush forth in a sudden stream or jet.

spurt

Move or act with a sudden increase in speed or energy.
*He cut his finger and blood **spurred** over the sliced potatoes.*

work

Be engaged in physical or mental activity in order to achieve a result do work.
*This method doesn't **work**.*

fabrication	The action or process of manufacturing or inventing something. <i>The story was a complete fabrication.</i>
<u>factory</u>	A building or group of buildings where goods are manufactured or assembled chiefly by machine. <i>Factory workers.</i>
fancied	Formed or conceived by the imagination. <i>A fancied wrong.</i>
