Acetaminophen is the **generic** form of the proprietary drug Tylenol.

ignore

Be ignorant of or in the dark about.

He **ignore**d her outraged question.

inappropriate Not suitable or proper in the circumstances.

Inappropriate shoes for a walk on the beach.

lapse An interval or passage of time.

There was a considerable **lapse** of time between the two events.

An electronic memory device.

The brain regions responsible for **memory**.



Place (something) where one cannot find it again.

wholly

To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly.

The distinction is not wholly clear.
