## Associations of "Forgetting" (30 Words)

<b>absolutely</b>	Used to express and emphasize one’s assent or agreement. <i>An <b>absolutely</b> magnificent painting.</i>
<b>altogether</b>	Including everything or everyone; in total. <i><b>Altogether</b> he earns close to a million dollars.</i>
<b>collectively</b>	In conjunction with; combined. <i>The audience <b>collectively</b> winced.</i>
<b>completely</b>	So as to be complete; with everything necessary. <i>It was <b>completely</b> different from what we expected.</i>
<b>conclusively</b>	In a way that is achieved easily or by a large margin. <i>The story had been <b>conclusively</b> debunked.</i>
<b>decisively</b>	In a manner that settles an issue convincingly or produces a definite result. <i>I want the person who wins the election to win <b>decisively</b>.</i>
<b>entirely</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’). <i>A school devoted <b>entirely</b> to the needs of problem children.</i>
<b>generic</b>	(of drugs) not protected by trademark. <i>Acetaminophen is the <b>generic</b> form of the proprietary drug Tylenol.</i>
<b>ignore</b>	Be ignorant of or in the dark about. <i>He <b>ignored</b> her outraged question.</i>
<b>inappropriate</b>	Not suitable or proper in the circumstances. <i><b>Inappropriate</b> shoes for a walk on the beach.</i>
<b>lapse</b>	An interval or passage of time. <i>There was a considerable <b>lapse</b> of time between the two events.</i>
<b>memory</b>	An electronic memory device. <i>The brain regions responsible for <b>memory</b>.</i>

<b>misplace</b>	Place (something) where one cannot find it again. <i>Crewe came back into the game when Strachan <b>misplaced</b> a pass in the midfield.</i>
<b>mnemonics</b>	A method or system for improving the memory.
<b>neglect</b>	The trait of neglecting responsibilities and lacking concern. <i>The house was in a terrible state of <b>neglect</b>.</i>
<b>obscurity</b>	The quality of being difficult to understand. <i>Poems of impenetrable <b>obscurity</b>.</i>
<b>outright</b>	Not by degrees or instalments. <i>The <b>outright</b> abolition of the death penalty.</i>
<b>overlook</b>	Watch over. <i>The <b>overlook</b> to the townsite.</i>
<b>perfectly</b>	In a perfect or faultless way. <i><b>Perfectly</b> clean glass bottles.</i>
<b>psyche</b>	The immaterial part of a person; the actuating cause of an individual life. <i>How does constant losing affect the <b>psyches</b> of young athletes.</i>
<b>recollection</b>	The process of remembering (especially the process of recovering information by mental effort). <i>To the best of my <b>recollection</b> no one ever had a bad word to say about him.</i>
<b>remember</b>	Recall knowledge from memory; have a recollection. <i>He has <b>remembered</b> the boy in his will.</i>
<b>solely</b>	Not involving anyone or anything else; only. <i>He is <b>solely</b> responsible for any debts the company may incur.</i>
<b>thoroughly</b>	Completely and absolutely good is sometimes used informally for thoroughly. <i>She was soon <b>thoroughly</b> bored.</i>
<b>totally</b>	Used to express agreement. <i>She is almost <b>totally</b> deaf.</i>
<b>undeserved</b>	Not warranted, merited, or earned. <i>Has an <b>undeserved</b> reputation as a coward.</i>
<b>unsuited</b>	Not right or appropriate. <i>He was totally <b>unsuited</b> for the job.</i>
<b>utterly</b>	Completely and without qualification; absolutely. <i><b>Utterly</b> miserable.</i>
<b>vanish</b>	Gradually cease to exist. <i>Moira <b>vanished</b> without trace.</i>

**wholly**

To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly.

*The distinction is not **wholly** clear.*
