important	Important in effect or meaning. <i>Writers as important as Hopkins.</i>
innovative	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. <i>Stylistically innovative works.</i>
<u>main</u>	Capable of standing syntactically alone as a complete sentence. <i>The main problem is one of resources.</i>
midway	At half the distance; at the middle. <i>He sensationally led the tournament at the midway point.</i>
<u>original</u>	An original creation i e an audio recording from which copies can be made. <i>The original cast.</i>
<u>originally</u>	With reference to the origin or beginning. <i>The suggestions so originally and persuasively outlined.</i>
<u>primary</u>	Of primary importance. <i>His expert handling of the primary and secondary literature is clear on every page.</i>
prime	Insert a primer into a gun mine or charge preparatory to detonation or firing. <i>Our manhood s prime vigor.</i>
principal	An actor who plays a principal role. <i>The principal amount of your investment.</i>

<u>radical</u>	Markedly new or introducing radical change. <i>The assumption of radical differences between the mental attributes of literate and non literate peoples.</i>
reformer	A disputant who advocates reform. <i>A skilled reformer of government spending.</i>
seminal	Relating to or derived from the seed of a plant. <i>The spermatozoa are washed to separate them from the seminal plasma.</i>
significantly	In a statistically significant way. <i>Their situation is significantly different from ours.</i>

<u>staple</u>	Secure or fasten with a staple or staples. <i>Staple fibers vary widely in length.</i>
