celebration	The action of celebrating an important day or event. <i>The celebration</i> of marriage.
ceremonial	A formal event performed on a special occasion. The Great Court was built to accommodate the grandest of <b>ceremonial</b> s.



ceremony	A formal religious or public occasion, especially one celebrating a particular event, achievement, or anniversary. The <b>ceremony</b> of smelling the cork and tasting the wine.
conceptualisation	Inventing or contriving an idea or explanation and formulating it mentally.
<u>conceptualization</u>	Inventing or contriving an idea or explanation and formulating it mentally. <i>Our experience is beyond any conceptualization</i> .
contrivance	An artificial or unnatural or obviously contrived arrangement of details or parts etc. <i>An assortment of electronic equipment and mechanical</i> <b>contrivances</b> .
creation	An artifact that has been brought into existence by someone. She treats fictional <b>creation</b> s as if they were real people.
design	A decorative or artistic work. The awkward <b>design</b> of the keyboard made operation difficult.
development	A district that has been developed to serve some purpose. Such land is practical for small park <b>development</b> s.
devising	The act that results in something coming to be. The <b>devising</b> of plans.
expression	Expression without words. The <b>expression</b> for the circumference of a circle is 2 r.
innovation	A new method, idea, product, etc. Technological <b>innovation</b> s designed to save energy.
<u>observance</u>	A rule to be followed by a religious order. The tramp gave them no <b>observance</b> .
office	A service conducted daily as part of the office. <i>He rented an <b>office</b> in the new building.</i>
ordinance	An authoritative rule. <i>His strict observance of religious <b>ordinance</b>s was no doubt quickened by the remorse he felt.</i>
<u>origination</u>	The act of starting something for the first time; introducing something new. Mortgage loan <b>originations</b> were up 15 per cent.
preparation	A substance that is specially made up, especially a medicine or food. <i>The <b>preparation</b> of a draft contract.</i>
rite	A social custom, practice, or conventional act. <i>The Byzantine <b>rite</b></i> .



<u>ritual</u>	A prescribed order for performing a ritual ceremony especially one characteristic of a particular religion or Church. <i>The role of <b>ritual</b> in religion.</i>
sacrament	A formal religious ceremony conferring a specific grace on those who receive it; the two Protestant ceremonies are baptism and the Lord's Supper; in the Roman Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox Church there are seven traditional r. <i>He heard Mass and received the</i> <b>sacrament</b> .
service	A company or agency that performs a public service subject to government regulation. The pitifully low wages gained from domestic <b>service</b> .
solemnity	A solemn and dignified feeling. <i>His ashes were laid to rest with great <b>solemnity</b>.</i>
<u>worship</u>	The activity of worshipping. The <b>worship</b> of celebrity and wealth.
