Synonyms of "Formulation" as a noun (23 Words)

celebration	The action of celebrating an important day or event. <i>The celebration of marriage.</i>
ceremonial	A formal event performed on a special occasion. <i>The Great Court was built to accommodate the grandest of ceremonials.</i>

ceremony	A formal religious or public occasion, especially one celebrating a particular event, achievement, or anniversary. <i>The ceremony of smelling the cork and tasting the wine.</i>
conceptualisation	Inventing or contriving an idea or explanation and formulating it mentally.
<u>conceptualization</u>	Inventing or contriving an idea or explanation and formulating it mentally. <i>Our experience is beyond any conceptualization.</i>
contrivance	An artificial or unnatural or obviously contrived arrangement of details or parts etc. <i>An assortment of electronic equipment and mechanical contrivances.</i>
creation	An artifact that has been brought into existence by someone. <i>She treats fictional creations as if they were real people.</i>
design	A decorative or artistic work. <i>The awkward design of the keyboard made operation difficult.</i>
development	A district that has been developed to serve some purpose. <i>Such land is practical for small park developments.</i>
devising	The act that results in something coming to be. <i>The devising of plans.</i>
expression	Expression without words. <i>The expression for the circumference of a circle is $2r$.</i>
innovation	A new method, idea, product, etc. <i>Technological innovations designed to save energy.</i>
<u>observance</u>	A rule to be followed by a religious order. <i>The tramp gave them no observance.</i>
office	A service conducted daily as part of the office. <i>He rented an office in the new building.</i>
ordinance	An authoritative rule. <i>His strict observance of religious ordinances was no doubt quickened by the remorse he felt.</i>
<u>origination</u>	The act of starting something for the first time; introducing something new. <i>Mortgage loan originations were up 15 per cent.</i>
preparation	A substance that is specially made up, especially a medicine or food. <i>The preparation of a draft contract.</i>
rite	A social custom, practice, or conventional act. <i>The Byzantine rite.</i>

ritual

A prescribed order for performing a ritual ceremony especially one characteristic of a particular religion or Church.

*The role of **ritual** in religion.*

sacrament

A formal religious ceremony conferring a specific grace on those who receive it; the two Protestant ceremonies are baptism and the Lord's Supper; in the Roman Catholic Church and the Eastern Orthodox Church there are seven traditional r.

*He heard Mass and received the **sacrament**.*

service

A company or agency that performs a public service subject to government regulation.

*The pitifully low wages gained from domestic **service**.*

solemnity

A solemn and dignified feeling.

*His ashes were laid to rest with great **solemnity**.*

worship

The activity of worshipping.

*The **worship** of celebrity and wealth.*
