altercation	A noisy argument or disagreement, especially in public. I had an altercation with the ticket collector.
argue	Present reasons and arguments. I wasn t going to argue with a gun.
<u>argument</u>	An independent variable associated with a function or proposition and determining its value For example in the expression y F x x the arguments of the function F are x and x and the value is y. <i>The argument over foreign aid goes on and on.</i>
bellicose	Having or showing a ready disposition to fight. A mood of bellicose jingoism.
bicker	Argue over petty things. The restless wheels whose flashing spokes bicker and burn.
brawl	A rough or noisy fight or quarrel. He d got into a drunken brawl in a bar.
combative	Inclined or showing an inclination to dispute or disagree, even to engage in law suits. <i>A combative impulse</i> .
conflict	Be in conflict. Parents and children s interests sometimes conflict .
<u>confrontational</u>	Tending to deal with situations in an aggressive way; hostile or argumentative. <i>He distanced himself from the</i> confrontational <i>approach adopted by his</i> <i>predecessor.</i>
<u>contend</u>	To make the subject of dispute, contention, or litigation. <i>He contends that the judge was wrong.</i>
<u>contention</u>	The act of competing as for profit or a prize. The captured territory was the main area of contention between the two countries.



<u>contentious</u>	Inclined or showing an inclination to dispute or disagree, even to engage in law suits. <i>The socio economic plan had been the subject of</i> contentious <i>debate</i> .
<u>controversy</u>	A contentious speech act; a dispute where there is strong disagreement. The design of the building has caused controversy .
counterattack	Make a counterattack.
<u>disagree</u>	(of statements or accounts) be inconsistent or fail to correspond. No one was willing to disagree with him.
<u>disagreement</u>	Lack of consensus or approval. There was some disagreement about the details.
<u>discord</u>	(of things) be different. The party s views were apt to discord with those of the leading members of the government.
disputatious	Fond of having heated arguments. A disputatious lawyer.
dispute	Take exception to. An industrial dispute .
dissension	Disagreement among those expected to cooperate. These issues caused bitter dissension in the party.
factious	Dissenting (especially dissenting with the majority opinion. A <i>factious</i> country.
<u>quarrel</u>	Have a heated argument or disagreement. We quarrel ed over the question as to who discovered America.
quarrelsome	Given to quarreling. <i>Quarrelsome</i> when drinking.
<u>rivalry</u>	Competition for the same objective or for superiority in the same field. There always has been intense rivalry between the clubs.
strife	Angry or bitter disagreement over fundamental issues; conflict. <i>Decades of civil strife</i> .
struggle	A forceful or violent effort to get free of restraint or resist attack. The centre is the result of the scientists struggle to realize their dream.
tussle	Make messy or untidy. There was a tussle for the ball.
<u>wrangle</u>	An instance of intense argument (as in bargaining. <i>Wrangle</i> horses.
wrangling	An instance of intense argument (as in bargaining. Weeks of political wrangling .
