- *A small or tiny part, amount, or proportion of something.*
- *A small part or item forming a piece of a whole.*
- *(in the Christian Church) the breaking of the Eucharistic bread.*
- *Each of the portions into which a mixture may be separated according to a physical property such as boiling point or solubility.*
- *A component of a mixture that has been separated by a fractional process.*
- *The quotient of two rational numbers.*

- bit** The cutting part of a drill usually pointed and threaded and is replaceable in a brace or bitstock or drill press.

- fragment** A piece broken off or cut off of something else.

<b>mite</b>	A minute arachnid which has four pairs of legs when adult, related to the ticks. Many kinds live in the soil and a number are parasitic on plants or animals.
<b>modicum</b>	A small or moderate or token amount- Ian Jack. <i>England still expects a <b>modicum</b> of eccentricity in its artists.</i>
<b>scrap</b>	Worthless material that is to be disposed of. <i>The unhappy couple got into a terrible <b>scrap</b>.</i>
<b>selection</b>	A plot of land acquired by selection. <i>There has been more than enough time for <b>selection</b> to generate specific DNA sequences of the required length.</i>
<b>shade</b>	A lampshade. <i>Don t argue about <b>shades</b> of meaning.</i>
<b>small part</b>	A garment size for a small person.
<b>smattering</b>	A small number or amount. <i>Edward had only a <b>smattering</b> of Welsh.</i>
<b>snippet</b>	A small piece of anything (especially a piece that has been snipped off). <i><b>Snippets</b> of information about the war.</i>
<b>souçon</b>	A slight but appreciable amount.
<b>spot</b>	A small feature or part of something with a particular quality. <i>A nice secluded <b>spot</b>.</i>
<b>touch</b>	An act of touching someone or something. <i>The cooling <b>touch</b> of the night air.</i>
<b>trifle</b>	A detail that is considered insignificant. <i>Syllabubs <b>trifles</b> and other dishes.</i>



### **Usage Examples of "Fraction" as a noun**

- *The dominant classes or fractions in capitalist societies.*
- *The Fraction may be accompanied by the Agnus Dei.*
- *He hesitated for a fraction of a second.*
- *The third fraction contain alcohols with boiling points of 120-130°C.*

## Synonyms of "Fraction" as a verb (1 Word)

**divide** Allocate (different parts of one's time or efforts) to different activities or places.  
**Divide** 4 into 20.

### apportion

Give out as one's portion or share.

*Voting power will be **apportioned** according to contribution.*

### **bit**

The cutting part of a drill usually pointed and threaded and is replaceable in a brace or bitstock or drill press.

*A **bit** of lint.*

### **cleavage**

The hollow between a woman's breasts when supported, especially as exposed by a low-cut garment.

*The cell undergoes **cleavage** and segmentation and develops into a blastula.*

### **cleave**

Split (a molecule) by breaking a particular chemical bond.

*They watched a coot **cleave** the smooth water.*

### dichotomy

A division or contrast between two things that are or are represented as being opposed or entirely different.

*The **dichotomy** between eastern and western culture.*

<b>divide</b>	Separate into parts or portions. <i>The cell clusters began to <b>divide</b> rapidly.</i>
<b>division</b>	A group of organisms forming a subdivision of a larger category. <i>The main <b>divisions</b> of the book.</i>
<b>flake</b>	A snowflake. <i>Cook until the fish <b>flakes</b> easily.</i>
<b>fractional</b>	Constituting or comprising a part or fraction of a possible whole or entirety. <i>There was a <b>fractional</b> hesitation before he said yes.</i>
<b>fracture</b>	A diphthong substituted by fracture. <i><b>Fracture</b> the balance of power.</i>
<b>fragment</b>	Break or cause to break into fragments. <i>Lough Erne <b>fragmented</b> into a series of lakes.</i>
<b>fragmentation</b>	Separating something into fine particles. <i><b>Fragmentation</b> slows system performance because it takes extra time to locate and assemble the parts of the fragmented file.</i>
<b>moiety</b>	A part or portion, especially a lesser share. <i>The enzyme removes the sulphate <b>moiety</b>.</i>
<b>part</b>	That which concerns a person with regard to a particular role or situation. <i>There was a good deal of kissing before we <b>parted</b>.</i>
<b>partially</b>	In part; in some degree; not wholly. <i>He was <b>partially</b> paralyzed.</i>
<b>partition</b>	Divide a room into smaller rooms or areas by erecting partitions. <i><b>Partition</b> chromatography.</i>
<b>piece</b>	To join or unite the pieces of. <i>She <b>pieced</b> a quilt.</i>
<b>portion</b>	A part of a whole. <i>Earthy fresh and generously <b>portioned</b> food.</i>
<b>rupture</b>	The act of making a sudden noisy break. <i>The <b>rupture</b> with his father would never be healed.</i>
<b>schism</b>	The formal separation of a church into two churches or the withdrawal of one group over doctrinal differences. <i>Another <b>schism</b> like that and they will wind up in bankruptcy.</i>
<b>scrap</b>	Make into scrap or refuse. <i>A bold decision was taken to <b>scrap</b> existing plant.</i>
<b>secant</b>	A straight line that cuts a curve in two or more parts.



<b><u>section</u></b>	Commit someone compulsorily to a psychiatric hospital in accordance with a section of a mental health act. <i>She began to <b>section</b> the grapefruit.</i>
<b><u>sector</u></b>	The minimum track length that can be assigned to store information unless otherwise specified a sector of data consists of 512 bytes. <i>The public <b>sector</b>.</i>
<b>segment</b>	Divide into segments. <i>A large <b>segment</b> of the local population.</i>
<b>segmentation</b>	Division into separate parts or sections. <i><b>Segmentation</b> of myocardial cells.</i>
<b>splinter</b>	Break up into splinters or slivers. <i>He got a <b>splinter</b> in his finger.</i>
<b><u>split</u></b>	The act of rending or ripping or splitting something. <i>The river had <b>split</b> into a number of channels.</i>
<b>subdivision</b>	An area composed of subdivided lots. <i>Subject <b>subdivisions</b>.</i>
<b>sunder</b>	Break apart or in two, using violence. <i>A universe <b>sundered</b> ages ago in a divine war.</i>
