Associations of "Framed" (30 Words)

anatomical	Of or relating to the branch of morphology that studies the structure of organisms. <i>Anatomical abnormalities.</i>
<u>bony</u>	Having bones especially many or prominent bones. <i>Bony fish.</i>
building	The occupants of a building. <i>There was a three story building on the corner.</i>
concave	Having an outline or surface that curves inwards like the interior of a circle or sphere. <i>Concave lenses.</i>
conduit	A channel for conveying water or other fluid. <i>Nearby springs supplied the conduit which ran into the brewery.</i>
cylindrical	Having the form of a cylinder. <i>The cavity is roughly cylindrical.</i>
forelimb	The front limb (or the homologous structure in other animals, such as a flipper or wing).
form	Give shape or form to. <i>His features formed into a smile of pleasure.</i>
framework	A hypothetical description of a complex entity or process. <i>A conservatory in a delicate framework of iron.</i>
jamb	A side post or surface of a doorway, window, or fireplace. <i>He leaned against the door jamb.</i>
lattice	An interlaced structure or pattern resembling a lattice. <i>A lattice fence.</i>
latticed	Decorated with or in the form of a lattice. <i>A latticed screen.</i>
lintel	Horizontal beam used as a finishing piece over a door or window.

<u>morph</u>	An image that has been morphed. <i>In the video Michael Jackson morphed into a panther.</i>
morphological	Relating to or concerned with the formation of admissible words in a language. <i>The purely morphological fact that with a little dam one could hold back a lot of water.</i>
<u>morphology</u>	The branch of biology that deals with the form of living organisms, and with relationships between their structures. <i>A generative approach to Italian morphology.</i>
osseous	Consisting of or turned into bone; ossified. <i>Osseous tissue.</i>
pane	A panel or section of panels in a wall or door.
<u>porch</u>	A structure attached to the exterior of a building often forming a covered entrance. <i>Daniel and Lydia sat out on the porch for many hours.</i>
porthole	An opening (in a wall or ship or armored vehicle) for firing through.
<u>shape</u>	Shape or influence give direction to. <i>She liked the shape of his nose.</i>
sill	A strong horizontal beam forming a base in the frame of a timber-framed building.
skeletal	Relating to or functioning as a skeleton. <i>A nightmare population of gaunt men and skeletal boys.</i>
<u>skeleton</u>	A sport in which a competitor races down a frozen track on a skeleton sled. <i>The building has a steel skeleton.</i>
<u>square</u>	Mark out in squares. <i>They felled and squared the timber themselves.</i>
structural	Concerned with systematic structure in a particular field of study. <i>Structural effects of folding and faulting of the earth s surface.</i>
structuralism	A method of interpretation and analysis of aspects of human cognition, behaviour, culture, and experience, which focuses on relationships of contrast between elements in a conceptual system.
structure	Give a structure to. <i>His lectures have no structure.</i>
tubular	Made from a tube or tubes. <i>Donatello is totally tubular when he s jamming.</i>

window

A framework of wood or metal that contains a glass windowpane and is built into a wall or roof to admit light or air.

*He stuck his head in the **window**.*
