## Frantic as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Frantic" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “frantic” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Marked by uncontrolled excitement or emotion.*
- *Distraught with fear, anxiety, or other emotion.*
- *Excessively agitated; distraught with fear or other violent emotion.*
- *Conducted in a hurried, excited, and disorganized way.*



## Synonyms of "Frantic" as an adjective (16 Words)

<b>agitated</b>	Physically disturbed or set in motion. <i>She was red and <b>agitated</b> with the effort of arguing.</i>
<b>berserk</b>	Out of control with anger or excitement; wild or frenzied. <i><b>Berserk</b> with grief.</i>
<b><u>delirious</u></b>	In a state of wild excitement or ecstasy. <i>A crowd of <b>delirious</b> baseball fans.</i>
<b><u>distraught</u></b>	Very worried and upset. <i><b>Distraught</b> with grief.</i>
<b>distressed</b>	Generalized feeling of distress. <i>Women in <b>distressed</b> circumstances.</i>
<b>excited</b>	Very enthusiastic and eager. <i>They were <b>excited</b> about the prospect.</i>

<b>frenetic</b>	Excessively agitated; distraught with fear or other violent emotion. <i>A <b>frenetic</b> pace of activity.</i>
<b>frenzied</b>	Affected with or marked by frenzy or mania uncontrolled by reason. <i>A <b>frenzied</b> attack.</i>
<b>mad</b>	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>I got <b>mad</b> respect for him.</i>
<b>overwrought</b>	Deeply agitated especially from emotion. <i>She was too <b>overwrought</b> to listen to reason.</i>
<b>panic-stricken</b>	Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation.
<b>panic-struck</b>	Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation.
<b>panicky</b>	Feeling or characterized by uncontrollable fear or anxiety. <i>I started to feel <b>panicky</b> and breathless.</i>
<b>phrenetic</b>	Excessively agitated; distraught with fear or other violent emotion.
<b><u>unrestrained</u></b>	Marked by uncontrolled excitement or emotion. <i>A display of <b>unrestrained</b> delight.</i>
<b>worked up</b>	Open.



## Usage Examples of "Frantic" as an adjective

- *She was frantic with worry.*
- *Frantic attempts to resuscitate the girl.*
- *Something frantic in their gaiety.*

<b>celerity</b>	Swiftness of movement.
<b>crazy</b>	Extremely. <i>Wore a <b>crazy</b> hat.</i>
<b>delirium</b>	Wild excitement or ecstasy. <i>A chorus of <b>delirium</b> from the terrace.</i>
<b>dizzy</b>	Make dizzy or giddy. <i>He looked around <b>dizzy</b> with happiness.</i>
<b>frenetic</b>	Fast and energetic in a rather wild and uncontrolled way. <i><b>Frenetic</b> screams followed the accident.</i>
<b>frenzied</b>	Wildly excited or uncontrolled. <i>The prosecutor s <b>frenzied</b> denunciation of the accused.</i>
<b>frenzy</b>	State of violent mental agitation. <i>Doreen worked herself into a <b>frenzy</b> of rage.</i>
<b>fury</b>	The hideous snake-haired monsters (usually three in number) who pursued unpunished criminals. <i>The <b>fury</b> of a gathering storm.</i>
<b>haste</b>	The act of moving hurriedly and in a careless manner. <i>I write in <b>haste</b>.</i>
<b>hasten</b>	Move or travel hurriedly. <i>We <b>hastened</b> back to Paris.</i>
<b>hectic</b>	A hectic fever or flush. <i>A <b>hectic</b> business schedule.</i>
<b>hie</b>	Move hurriedly. <i>I <b>hied</b> down to New Orleans.</i>
<b>hurry</b>	A condition of urgency making it necessary to hurry. <i><b>Hurry</b> it s late.</i>
<b>hysteria</b>	Excessive or uncontrollable fear. <i>The anti Semitic <b>hysteria</b> of the 1890s.</i>



<b><u>insane</u></b>	In a state of mind which prevents normal perception, behaviour, or social interaction; seriously mentally ill. <i>Was declared <b>insane</b>.</i>
<b><u>lunatic</u></b>	An insane person. <i>He would be asked to acquiesce in some <b>lunatic</b> scheme.</i>
<b>mad</b>	Make someone mad. <i>A <b>mad</b> whirl of pleasure.</i>
<b>mania</b>	An irrational but irresistible motive for a belief or action. <i>Many people suffering from <b>mania</b> do not think anything is wrong.</i>
<b>manic</b>	Affected with or marked by frenzy or mania uncontrolled by reason. <i>The pace is utterly <b>manic</b>.</i>
<b>overwrought</b>	Deeply agitated especially from emotion. <i>A pseudo Gothic church far too <b>overwrought</b> for such a small town.</i>
<b>psychosis</b>	A severe mental disorder in which thought and emotions are so impaired that contact is lost with external reality. <i>They were suffering from a <b>psychosis</b>.</i>
<b>quicken</b>	Give or restore life to. <i>The fetus <b>quicken</b>ed.</i>
<b><u>rabid</u></b>	(of an animal) affected with rabies. <i><b>Rabid</b> isolationist.</i>
<b>raving</b>	In a raving manner. <i><b>Raving</b> mad.</i>
<b>rush</b>	Cause to move fast or to rush or race. <i>She felt a <b>rush</b> of cold air.</i>
<b>rushing</b>	The act of moving hurriedly and in a careless manner. <i>He is becoming the best <b>rushing</b> quarterback in NFL history.</i>
<b>schizophrenia</b>	Any of several psychotic disorders characterized by distortions of reality and disturbances of thought and language and withdrawal from social contact. <i>Gibraltar s <b>schizophrenia</b> continues to be fed by colonial pride.</i>
<b>swiftness</b>	Lack of delay; promptness. <i>Kay had the upper hand with her agility and <b>swiftness</b>.</i>
<b>urgently</b>	In a way which requires immediate action or attention. <i>Health care reform is needed <b>urgently</b>.</i>
<b>wild</b>	A wild primitive state untouched by civilization. <i>A <b>wild</b> stretch of land.</i>
