after	At a later or future time afterwards. <i>Duke Frederick died soon after.</i>
almanac	An annual publication containing tabular information in a particular field or fields arranged according to the calendar of a given year.
annually	Once a year; every year. <i>The prize is awarded annually.</i>
biannual	Occurring or payable twice each year. <i>The biannual meeting of the planning committee.</i>
biennial	Botany a plant having a life cycle that normally takes two seasons from germination to death to complete flowering biennials usually bloom and fruit in the second season. <i>They met at biennial conventions.</i>
calendar	Enter something in a calendar or timetable. <i>I have you on my calendar for next Monday.</i>
daily	Done, produced, or occurring every day or every weekday. <i>The museum is open daily.</i>
diurnal	Of or during the day. <i>Diurnal rhythms.</i>
enduring	Lasting over a period of time; durable. <i>He formed a number of enduring relationships with women.</i>
every	Each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception. <i>Every two hours.</i>
hour	A time of day specified as an exact number of hours from midnight or midday. <i>The clock in the sitting room struck the hour.</i>
illimitable	Without limits or an end. <i>The illimitable human capacity for evil.</i>

infinite	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>Intimations of the infinite.</i>
late	At or toward an end or late period or stage of development. <i>It happened late in 1994.</i>
oft	Many times at short intervals. <i>We often met over a cup of coffee.</i>
passing	In sport the action of passing a ball to another team member. <i>I will mention only one particular aspect of the current mess because this one is surely something new and passing strange.</i>
perennial	A perennial plant. <i>He s a perennial student.</i>
period	A set of elements occupying a horizontal row in the periodic table. <i>The early medieval period.</i>
periodic	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. <i>Periodic feelings of anxiety.</i>
periodically	From time to time; occasionally. <i>The students received help from a friend only periodically.</i>
quarterly	A magazine or journal that is published four times a year. <i>Interest is compounded quarterly.</i>
regular	A regular customer member of a team etc. <i>Policies carried on by his ministers through regular channels.</i>
regularly	At uniform intervals of time. <i>The person who regularly cuts your hair.</i>
renewable	A natural resource or source of energy that is not depleted by use, such as water, wind, or solar power. <i>Renewable energy such as solar energy is theoretically inexhaustible.</i>
semiannual	Occurring or payable twice each year.
thereafter	After that time. <i>Thereafter he never called again.</i>
timing	The choice, judgement, or control of when something should be done. <i>The introduction of new signal timings.</i>
unfettered	Unrestrained or uninhibited. <i>Unfettered artistic genius.</i>
weekly	A periodical that is published every week (or 52 issues per year). <i>She visited her aunt weekly.</i>
year	A year regarded in terms of the quality of something produced. <i>A school year.</i>
