## Synonyms of "Frenzy" as a noun (22 Words)

- agitation** A state of agitation or turbulent change or development.  
*The techniques mostly involve **agitation** by stirring.*
- bout** A division during which one team is on the offensive.  
*He fought 350 **bouts** losing only nine times.*
- craze** State of violent mental agitation.  
*The new **craze** for step aerobics.*
- delirium** A usually brief state of excitement and mental confusion often accompanied by hallucinations.  
*A chorus of **delirium** from the terrace.*
- dementedness** Mental deterioration of organic or functional origin.
- derangement** A state of mental disturbance and disorientation.

<b><u>distraction</u></b>	Extreme agitation of the mind. <i>The firm found passenger travel a <b>distraction</b> from the main business of moving freight.</i>
<b>fever</b>	Intense nervous anticipation. <i>Election <b>fever</b> reaches its climax tomorrow.</i>
<b>feverishness</b>	A rise in the temperature of the body; frequently a symptom of infection.
<b>fit</b>	The particular way in which something especially a garment or component fits. <i>He had a <b>fit</b>.</i>
<b><u>fury</u></b>	Extreme strength or violence in an action or a natural phenomenon. <i>Tears of <b>fury</b> and frustration.</i>
<b><u>hysteria</u></b>	Excessive or uncontrollable fear. <i>The anti Semitic <b>hysteria</b> of the 1890s.</i>
<b><u>insanity</u></b>	Relatively permanent disorder of the mind. <i>It might be pure <b>insanity</b> to take this loan.</i>
<b><u>madness</u></b>	Unrestrained excitement or enthusiasm. <i>Poetry is a sort of divine <b>madness</b>.</i>
<b>mania</b>	An irrational but irresistible motive for a belief or action. <i>He had a <b>mania</b> for automobiles.</i>
<b>outburst</b>	A sudden intense happening. <i>An <b>outburst</b> of heavy rain.</i>
<b>paroxysm</b>	A sudden attack or outburst of a particular emotion or activity. <i>A <b>paroxysm</b> of giggling.</i>
<b>seizure</b>	The act of taking of a person by force. <i>The <b>seizure</b> of the Assembly building.</i>
<b><u>spasm</u></b>	Prolonged involuntary muscle contraction. <i>The airways in the lungs go into <b>spasm</b>.</i>
<b>tumult</b>	A state of confusion or disorder. <i>His personal <b>tumult</b> ended when he began writing songs.</i>
<b><u>turmoil</u></b>	A violent disturbance. <i>He endured years of inner <b>turmoil</b>.</i>
<b>wildness</b>	Lack of sound reasoning or probability. <i>Liza had always had a tendency to <b>wildness</b>.</i>

## Associations of "Frenzy" (30 Words)

**bipolar**

Of a person suffering from bipolar disorder.  
*A sharply **bipolar** division of affluent and underclass.*

**crazy**

Extremely enthusiastic.  
*I m **crazy** about Cindy.*

**delirium**

Wild excitement or ecstasy.  
*Somewhere a patient shouted in **delirium**.*

**enthusiasm**

Something that arouses enthusiasm.  
***Enthusiasm** for his program is growing.*

**epilepsy**

A disorder of the central nervous system characterized by loss of consciousness and convulsions.

**excitement**

Something that arouses a feeling of excitement.  
*He could hardly conceal his **excitement** when she agreed.*

**fanatic**

A person motivated by irrational enthusiasm (as for a cause)-Winston Churchill.  
*A **fanatic** is one who can t change his mind and won t change the subject.*

<b>frantic</b>	Conducted in a hurried, excited, and disorganized way. <i>She was <b>frantic</b> with worry.</i>
<b>frenetic</b>	Excessively agitated; distraught with fear or other violent emotion. <i>A <b>frenetic</b> pace of activity.</i>
<b>frenzied</b>	Affected with or marked by frenzy or mania uncontrolled by reason. <i>The prosecutor s <b>frenzied</b> denunciation of the accused.</i>
<b>fury</b>	Wild or violent anger. <i>Rachel shouted beside herself with <b>fury</b>.</i>
<b>hypersensitive</b>	Having extreme physical sensitivity to particular substances or conditions. <i><b>Hypersensitive</b> to pollen.</i>
<b>hysteria</b>	Exaggerated or uncontrollable emotion or excitement. <i>The anti Semitic <b>hysteria</b> of the 1890s.</i>
<b>hysterical</b>	Extremely funny. <i><b>Hysterical</b> laughter.</i>
<b>insane</b>	Very foolish. <i><b>Insane</b> laughter.</i>
<b>lunatic</b>	Insane and believed to be affected by the phases of the moon. <i>He would be asked to acquiesce in some <b>lunatic</b> scheme.</i>
<b>mad</b>	Make someone mad. <i><b>Mad</b> at his friend.</i>
<b>mania</b>	An excessive enthusiasm or desire; an obsession. <i>He had a <b>mania</b> for automobiles.</i>
<b>manic</b>	Affected with or marked by frenzy or mania uncontrolled by reason- H.W.Carter. <i>The pace is utterly <b>manic</b>.</i>
<b>neurosis</b>	(in non-technical use) excessive and irrational anxiety or obsession. <i>Freud s two stage account of <b>neurosis</b>.</i>
<b>overwrought</b>	(of a piece of writing or a work of art) too elaborate or complicated in design or construction. <i>A pseudo Gothic church far too <b>overwrought</b> for such a small town.</i>
<b>paranoia</b>	Unjustified suspicion and mistrust of other people. <i>Mild <b>paranoia</b> afflicts all prime ministers.</i>
<b>passionate</b>	Arising from intense feelings of sexual love. <i><b>Passionate</b> pleas for help.</i>
<b>psychosis</b>	Any severe mental disorder in which contact with reality is lost or highly distorted. <i>They were suffering from a <b>psychosis</b>.</i>

**rabid**

Of or infected by rabies.  
*Her mother was bitten by a **rabid** dog.*

**raving**

In a raving manner.  
*Have you gone **raving** mad.*

**rushing**

The action of moving with urgent haste.  
*Despite all the **rushing** and hustling we still feel on Christmas there is something wonderful about life.*

**schizophrenia**

Any of several psychotic disorders characterized by distortions of reality and disturbances of thought and language and withdrawal from social contact.  
*Gibraltar's **schizophrenia** continues to be fed by colonial pride.*

**spinster**

An elderly unmarried woman.

**zealous**

Marked by active interest and enthusiasm.  
*The council was extremely **zealous** in the application of the regulations.*
