## Frequency as a Noun

### Definitions of "Frequency" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “frequency” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The fact or state of being frequent or happening often.*
- *The ratio of the number of observations in a statistical category to the total number of observations.*
- *The number of observations in a given statistical category.*
- *The rate per second of a vibration constituting a wave, either in a material (as in sound waves), or in an electromagnetic field (as in radio waves and light).*
- *The rate at which something occurs over a particular period of time or in a given sample.*
- *The number of occurrences within a given time period.*
- *The particular waveband at which radio signals are broadcast or transmitted.*



## Synonyms of "Frequency" as a noun (9 Words)

<b>absolute frequency</b>	Something that is conceived or that exists independently and not in relation to other things; something that does not depend on anything else and is beyond human control; something that is not relative.
<b>amount</b>	A quantity of something, especially the total of a thing or things in number, size, value, or extent. <i>An adequate <b>amount</b> of food for four people.</i>
<b>commonness</b>	Sharing of common attributes.
<b>frequence</b>	The number of occurrences within a given time period.
<b><u>incidence</u></b>	The way in which the burden of a tax falls upon the population. <i>He measured the angle of <b>incidence</b> of the reflected light.</i>
<b>oftenness</b>	The number of occurrences within a given time period.
<b><u>prevalence</u></b>	A superiority in numbers or amount. <i>He was surprised by the <b>prevalence</b> of optimism about the future.</i>
<b>rate of occurrence</b>	The relative speed of progress or change.
<b>relative frequency</b>	A person related by blood or marriage.



## **Usage Examples of "Frequency" as a noun**

- *The frequency of modulation was 40 cycles per second.*
- *A radio station on a single AM radio frequency.*
- *An increase in the frequency of accidents due to increased overtime.*
- *The frequency of his seizures increased as he grew older.*
- *A coding sequence to ensure that everyone changes frequency in the correct manner.*
- *Different thicknesses of glass will absorb different frequencies of sound.*



## Associations of "Frequency" (30 Words)

<b>always</b>	Repeatedly and annoyingly. <i>There is <b>always</b> some pollution in the air.</i>
<b><u>amplitude</u></b>	Breadth, range, or magnitude. <i>The <b>amplitude</b> of the crime of manslaughter lies beneath murder.</i>
<b><u>dabble</u></b>	(of a duck or other waterbird) move the bill around in shallow water while feeding. <i>They <b>dabbled</b> their feet in the rock pools.</i>
<b><u>ever</u></b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i><b>Ever</b> hoping to strike it rich.</i>
<b><u>frequent</u></b>	Be a regular or frequent visitor to a certain place. <i>Pubs <b>frequented</b> by soldiers.</i>
<b><u>frequently</u></b>	Regularly or habitually; often. <i>They go abroad <b>frequently</b>.</i>
<b><u>incidence</u></b>	The striking of a light beam on a surface. <i>The entire <b>incidence</b> falls on the workers.</i>
<b>infrequently</b>	Not often; rarely. <i>A storage area for <b>infrequently</b> used items.</i>
<b>intermittently</b>	In an intermittent manner. <i>An <b>intermittently</b> amusing plot.</i>
<b>modulated</b>	Changed or adjusted in pitch, tone, or volume.
<b>occasional</b>	Recurring or reappearing from time to time. <i>He wrote <b>occasional</b> verse for patrons.</i>
<b><u>occasionally</u></b>	At infrequent or irregular intervals; now and then. <i>We met up <b>occasionally</b> for a drink.</i>
<b>oft</b>	Many times at short intervals. <i>An <b>oft</b> quoted tenet.</i>
<b>often</b>	In many instances. <i>Vocabulary <b>often</b> reflects social standing.</i>
<b>oftentimes</b>	Many times at short intervals. <i>Sensory processing is <b>oftentimes</b> a challenge for someone with ASD.</i>
<b>periodically</b>	From time to time; occasionally. <i>The students received help from a friend only <b>periodically</b>.</i>
<b><u>proportional</u></b>	One of the quantities in a mathematical proportion. <i>The punishment should be <b>proportional</b> to the crime.</i>

<b>quite</b>	To a degree (not used with a negative). <i>You've no intention of coming back I'm <b>quite</b> sorry but no I have not.</i>
<b>rare</b>	Not widely known; especially valued for its uncommonness. <i><b>Rare</b> gasses.</i>
<b>rarely</b>	Not often; seldom. <i>We <b>rarely</b> met.</i>
<b>rareness</b>	Noteworthy scarcity.
<b>recidivism</b>	Habitual relapse into crime. <i>The prison has succeeded in reducing <b>recidivism</b>.</i>
<b>recurrent</b>	(of a nerve or blood vessel) turning back so as to reverse direction. <i>The <b>recurrent</b> nerve leaves the hypocerebral ganglion.</i>
<b>regularity</b>	The quality of being characterized by a fixed principle or rate. <i>He came to see her with increasing <b>regularity</b>.</i>
<b>rife</b>	In an unchecked or widespread manner. <i>The streets were <b>rife</b> with rumour and fear.</i>
<b>sometimes</b>	On certain occasions or in certain cases but not always. <i><b>Sometimes</b> I want to do things on my own.</i>
<b>sparse</b>	Scanty; in short supply. <i>Areas of <b>sparse</b> population.</i>
<b>sporadically</b>	In a sporadic manner. <i>He only works <b>sporadically</b>.</i>
<b>successively</b>	In proper order or sequence. <i>He served <b>successively</b> as a major and a lieutenant colonel.</i>
<b>wave</b>	Set waves in. <i>Fear came over me in <b>waves</b>.</i>
