In many cases or instances. often

Vocabulary **often** reflects social standing.

Frequently; many times. oftentimes

In a regular way without variation. regularly

The reunion has taken place **regularly** every two years.

Frequently and without proper consideration of the consequences.

Owners **routinely** flout local laws about restraining and picking up after their routinely

pets.

Under normal conditions; generally.

usually He **usually** arrives home about one o clock.

Used as intensifiers; 'real' is sometimes used informally for 'really'; 'rattling' very often

is informal.

The number of occurrences within a given time period.

A radio station on a single AM radio **frequency**.

**frequent**Frequently encountered.

Bears which persisted in **frequent**ing developed areas.

The way in which the burden of a tax falls upon the population.

The point of **incidence** of the beam.

infrequently Not many times.

He cooks but only **infrequently**.

intermittently At irregular intervals; not continuously or steadily.

**ntermittently** An **intermittently** amusing plot.

**invariably** Without variation or change, in every case. *Ranch meals are invariably big and hearty.* 

**modulated** Changed or adjusted in pitch, tone, or volume.

(of furniture) made or adapted for use on a particular occasion or for

**occasional** infrequent use.

Took an **occasional** glass of wine.

occasionally Now and then or here and there.

*Very occasionally* the condition can result in death.

oft Many times at short intervals.

An **oft** quoted tenet.

often Many times at short intervals.
