itchy Having or causing an itch.

She was too **overwrought** to listen to reason.

querulous Habitually complaining.

She became **querulous** and demanding.

restive Impatient especially under restriction or delay.

Both their horses became **restive** at once.

stressed Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed.

Stressed concrete walls.

Pronounced with relatively tense tongue muscles e g the vowel sound in

tense beat.

Relations between the two neighbouring states were **tense**.

Conducive to or feeling mental discomfort.

uncomfortable An uncomfortable silence.

Causing or fraught with or showing anxiety.

Uneasy about his health.

unsettled Not yet settled.

A spell of **unsettled** weather.

Mildly physically distressed.

whiney Habitually complaining.

Having a complaining tone.

whiny

He speaks in a whiny childish voice.

jittery Being in a tense state.

Caffeine makes me **jittery**.

nervously

In an anxiously nervous manner.

Kevin **nervously** glanced at his watch.

nervy Showing or requiring courage and contempt of danger.

A **nervy** thing to say.

peevish Easily irritated or annoyed.

A thin **peevish** voice.

(of a person or their manner) childishly sulky or bad-tempered.

He was moody and **petulant**.

querulous Complaining in a rather petulant or whining manner.

She became **querulous** and demanding.

regret Express with regret.

I **regret** I can t come to the party.

Of a mainly liquid substance having been strained to separate out any solid

strained matter.

A con**strained** smile.

Become stretched or tense or taut.
