<b>accessibility</b>	The quality of being easy to obtain or use. <i>Students were concerned about the <b>accessibility</b> of quality academic counselling.</i>
<b>affability</b>	A disposition to be friendly and approachable (easy to talk to). <i>An air of benign <b>affability</b>.</i>
<b>affection</b>	A gentle feeling of fondness or liking. <i>He had trouble expressing the <b>affection</b> he felt.</i>
<b>affectionateness</b>	A quality proceeding from feelings of affection or love.
<b>amenability</b>	The trait of being cooperative.
<b>amiability</b>	A cheerful and agreeable mood. <i>His good natured <b>amiability</b>.</i>

<b>approachability</b>	The attribute of being easy to meet or deal with.
<b><u>benevolence</u></b>	The quality of being well meaning; kindness.
<b>communicativeness</b>	The quality of being willing, eager, or able to talk or impart information. <i>His questions encouraged her <b>communicativeness</b>.</i>
<b>companionability</b>	Suitability to be a companion.
<b>companionableness</b>	Suitability to be a companion.
<b>comradeship</b>	The quality of affording easy familiarity and sociability. <i>His greatest joy came from <b>comradeship</b> with others in the team.</i>
<b>congeniality</b>	A congenial disposition.
<b>conviviality</b>	A boisterous celebration; a merry festivity. <i>The <b>conviviality</b> of the evening.</i>
<b>cordiality</b>	A cordial disposition.
<b>demonstrativeness</b>	Tending to express your feelings freely.
<b>easy-going manner</b>	How something is done or how it happens.
<b>geniality</b>	The quality of having a friendly and cheerful manner. <i>He was endowed with <b>geniality</b> and good humour.</i>
<b>good humour</b>	That which is pleasing or valuable or useful.
<b>good nature</b>	Articles of commerce.
<b>good-naturedness</b>	A cheerful willingness to be obliging.
<b>gregariousness</b>	The quality of being gregarious-having a dislike of being alone.
<b>hospitableness</b>	Having a disposition that welcomes guests and is fond of entertaining.
<b>joviality</b>	Feeling jolly and jovial and full of good humor.
<b>kindliness</b>	The quality of being kind, warm-hearted, or gentle; kindness.
<b>kindness</b>	The quality of being friendly, generous, and considerate. <i>It would be a <b>kindness</b> on your part to invite her.</i>
<b>lack of inhibition</b>	The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.
<b>lack of reservation</b>	The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.
<b>neighbourliness</b>	A disposition to be friendly and helpful to neighbors.
<b><u>openness</u></b>	(in sport) a style of play characterized by action which is spread out over the field. <i>The <b>openness</b> of the Western landscape.</i>

**sociability**

A party of people assembled to promote sociability and communal activity.

*For all his **sociability** he never really connects with people.*

**sympathy**

Feelings of pity and sorrow for someone else's misfortune.

*The special **sympathy** between the two boys was obvious to all.*

**warmth**

Intensity of emotion.

*Of course not he snapped with a **warmth** that he regretted.*

## Associations of "Friendliness" (30 Words)

<b>affable</b>	Diffusing warmth and friendliness. <i>An <b>affable</b> smile.</i>
<b><u>amiable</u></b>	Disposed to please- Hal Hinson. <i>An <b>amiable</b> gathering.</i>
<b>benefactor</b>	A person who helps people or institutions (especially with financial help). <i>A low interest loan from a <b>benefactor</b> allowed them to build a floor for the exhibition hall.</i>
<b>benefic</b>	Exerting a favorable or beneficent influence. <i>A <b>benefic</b> star.</i>
<b>beneficence</b>	The quality of being kind or helpful or generous.
<b><u>benevolence</u></b>	An act intending or showing kindness and good will.
<b>benignity</b>	An act of kindness. <i>His air of <b>benignity</b>.</i>
<b><u>candid</u></b>	(of a photograph of a person) taken informally, especially without the subject's knowledge. <i>A <b>candid</b> interview.</i>
<b><u>candor</u></b>	The quality of being honest and straightforward in attitude and speech.
<b>compassion</b>	A deep awareness of and sympathy for another's suffering. <i>The victims should be treated with <b>compassion</b>.</i>
<b><u>courteous</u></b>	Characterized by courtesy and gracious good manners. <i>A <b>courteous</b> young man.</i>
<b><u>courtesy</u></b>	(especially of transport) supplied free of charge to people who are already paying for another service. <i>A <b>courtesy</b> car.</i>
<b>decency</b>	The requirements of accepted or respectable behaviour. <i>She had the <b>decency</b> to come and confess.</i>
<b><u>discourteous</u></b>	Showing no courtesy; rude. <i>It would be unkind and <b>discourteous</b> to decline a visit.</i>
<b><u>favor</u></b>	A feeling of favorable regard. <i>That style is in <b>favor</b> this season.</i>
<b><u>generosity</u></b>	The trait of being willing to give your money or time. <i>Diners certainly cannot complain about the <b>generosity</b> of portions.</i>
<b>generous</b>	Not petty in character and mind. <i>A <b>generous</b> helping of pasta.</i>

<b>goodness</b>	The beneficial or nourishing element of food. <i>A belief in the basic <b>goodness</b> of mankind.</i>
<b>goodwill</b>	Friendly, helpful, or cooperative feelings or attitude. <i>The scheme is dependent on <b>goodwill</b> between the two sides.</i>
<b>gracefulness</b>	Beautiful carriage.
<b>honest</b>	Without pretensions. <i>Worked at an <b>honest</b> trade.</i>
<b>honesty</b>	Referring to or using a way of charging for goods or services that relies on the customers to leave money in an unattended receptacle even though there is no one to collect their payments. <i>They spoke with convincing <b>honesty</b> about their fears.</i>
<b>kind</b>	Agreeable, conducive to comfort. <i>Thanked her for her <b>kind</b> letter.</i>
<b>kindness</b>	The quality of being friendly, generous, and considerate. <i>It would be a <b>kindness</b> on your part to invite her.</i>
<b>largess</b>	Liberality in bestowing gifts; extremely liberal and generous of spirit.
<b>nice</b>	Pleasant or pleasing or agreeable in nature or appearance- George Meredith. <i>We had a very <b>nice</b> time.</i>
<b>openness</b>	Willingness or readiness to receive (especially impressions or ideas). <i>It is the <b>openness</b> to possibilities that creates great research.</i>
<b>probity</b>	Complete and confirmed integrity; having strong moral principles. <i>Financial <b>probity</b>.</i>
<b>straightness</b>	Trueness of course toward a goal.
<b>truthfulness</b>	The quality of being truthful. <i>The <b>truthfulness</b> of her playing of an ageing American spinster.</i>
