ruffle	A strip of pleated material used as a decoration or a trim.
trimming	A state of arrangement or appearance. <i>Roast turkey with all the trimmings.</i>

bind

Of a quantifier be applied to a given variable so that the variable falls within its scope For example in an expression of the form For every x if x is a dog x is an animal the universal quantifier is binding the variable x.

border

braid	Edge or trim a garment with braid. <i>When I was a kid I loved braiding my hair.</i>
circle	Form or draw a circle around. <i>Encircle the errors.</i> Draw a line around.
circumscribe	<i>Our actions are circumscribed by our biology personality and by the social and cultural context into which we are born.</i>
edge	Ski with one s weight on the edges of one s skis. <i>Connecticut avoided an upset and edged Yale 49 48.</i>
encircle	Form a circle around; surround. <i>Encircle the errors.</i>
enclose	Enclose or enfold completely with or as if with a covering. <i>The lamp was enclosed in a frosted glass globe.</i>
encompass	Include in scope; include as part of something broader; have as one's sphere or territory. <i>No studies encompass all sectors of medical care.</i>
flank	Guard or strengthen (a military force or position) from the side. <i>The ship went straight through the enemy fleet and flanked them.</i>
hem	Fold over and sew together to provide with a hem. <i>Hem my skirt.</i>
line	Mark with lines. <i>Draw a line.</i>
rim	Roll around the rim of. <i>Sugar rimmed the dessert plate.</i>
ring	Attach a ring to the foot of in order to identify. <i>Only a small proportion of warblers are caught and ringed.</i>
skirt	Extend on all sides of simultaneously; encircle. <i>She skirted the problem.</i>
surround	Surround so as to force to give up. <i>He loves to surround himself with family and friends.</i>
trim	Adjust the balance of a ship or aircraft by rearranging its cargo or by means of its trim tabs. <i>Trim the photograph.</i>
verge	Be very close or similar to. <i>His behavior verges on the criminal.</i>

alternative	(of two things) mutually exclusive. <i>Alternative possibilities were neutrality or war.</i>
avant-garde	Radically new or original.
<u>experimental</u>	Relating to or based on experiment. <i>An experimental drug.</i>
extreme	Far beyond a norm in quantity or amount or degree; to an utmost degree. <i>In extreme cases the soldier may be discharged.</i>
innovative	(of a person) introducing new ideas; original and creative in thinking. <i>Innovative ways to help unemployed people.</i>

fur	Animal skin with fur on it or fabric resembling this used in making or trimming garments. <i>A long lean muscular cat with sleek fur.</i>
furry	Covered with a dense coat of fine silky hairs. <i>The furry fandom.</i>
fuzzy	Relating to a form of set theory and logic in which predicates may have degrees of applicability, rather than simply being true or false. It has important uses in artificial intelligence and the design of control systems. <i>The picture is very fuzzy.</i>
hackles	A feeling of anger and animosity. <i>Having one s hackles or dander up.</i>
hair	Hairs collectively especially those growing on a person s head. <i>They escaped by a hair s breadth.</i>
haired	Having hair of a specified kind. <i>A curly haired boy.</i>
hairy	Having a rough feel or appearance suggestive of coarse hair. <i>A hairy chest.</i>
hirsute	Hairy. <i>Their hirsute chests.</i>
mohair	A yarn or fabric made from mohair typically mixed with wool. <i>A mohair sweater.</i>
molt	Cast off hair, skin, horn, or feathers.
moustache	A long moustache. <i>A clergyman with long grey moustaches.</i>
mustache	An unshaved growth of hair on the upper lip. <i>He looked younger after he shaved off his mustache.</i>
nylon	Stockings or tights made of nylon. <i>The tent is made of blue nylon.</i>
otter	The fur of an otter.
plume	Deck with a plume. <i>Smoke plumed from the chimneys.</i>
plush	Richly luxurious and expensive. <i>A plush Mayfair flat.</i>
shave	Reduce by a small amount. <i>The barber shaves customers with a traditional cut throat razor.</i>

- shear** Cut off something such as hair wool or grass with scissors or shears.
*Aluminium is not very resilient to **shear** forces.*
- tassel** Decorate with a tassel or tassels.
*Damask curtains were held by silk cords with gold **tassels**.*
- trim** Adjust the balance of a ship or aircraft by rearranging its cargo or by means of its trim tabs.
***Trim** the grass using a sharp mower.*
- whisker** Furnish with whiskers.
*A **whiskered** jersey.*
- whiskered** Having hair on the cheeks and chin.
