## Associations of "Frowned upon" (30 Words)

<b>afire</b>	Lighted up by or as by fire or flame. <i>The whole mill was <b>afire</b>.</i>
<b>alight</b>	To come to rest, settle. <i>The conductor <b>alights</b> to push the cable car completely around.</i>
<b>angry</b>	Feeling or showing strong annoyance, displeasure, or hostility; full of anger. <i>Why are you <b>angry</b> with me.</i>
<b>choleric</b>	(in medieval medicine) having cholera as the predominant bodily humour. <i>A <b>choleric</b> outburst.</i>
<b>dazzle</b>	To cause someone to lose clear vision, especially from intense light. <i>I was <b>dazzled</b> by the beauty and breadth of the exhibition.</i>
<b>discourage</b>	Deprive of courage or hope take away hope from cause to feel discouraged. <i>We should <b>discourage</b> this practice among our youth.</i>
<b>face</b>	The part of an animal corresponding to the human face. <i>Jackson <b>faced</b> Smith in the boxing ring.</i>
<b>filament</b>	A slender threadlike object or fibre, especially one found in animal or plant structures. <i>Each myosin <b>filament</b> is usually surrounded by 12 actin <b>filaments</b>.</i>
<b>flame</b>	A brilliant orange red colour like that of flames. <i>Warm the whisky slightly pour over the lobster and <b>flame</b> it.</i>
<b>flaming</b>	(of a gay man) having a manner or appearance regarded as stereotypically homosexual. <i>Her <b>flaming</b> hair.</i>
<b>flare</b>	Become flared and widen usually at one end. <i>Infection can cause a lupus <b>flare</b>.</i>
<b>flash</b>	A newsflash. <i>A shooting star <b>flashed</b> and was gone.</i>

<b>fury</b>	A surge of violent anger or other strong feeling. <i>In a <b>fury</b> he lashed the horse on.</i>
<b>gawk</b>	Look with amazement; look stupidly. <i>They were <b>gawking</b> at some pin up.</i>
<b>glare</b>	An angry stare. <i>The moon <b>glared</b> back at itself from the lake s surface.</i>
<b>gleam</b>	An appearance of reflected light. <i>Affection <b>gleamed</b> in her large green eyes.</i>
<b>glower</b>	Look at with a fixed gaze. <i>The angry <b>glower</b> on the face of the policeman.</i>
<b>illuminate</b>	Decorate (a building or structure) with lights for a special occasion. <i>His face was <b>illuminated</b> by a smile.</i>
<b>illumine</b>	Light up; brighten. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was <b>illumined</b>.</i>
<b>inflammable</b>	Easily set on fire. <i><b>Inflammable</b> materials.</i>
<b>irascible</b>	Quickly aroused to anger. <i>An <b>irascible</b> and difficult man.</i>
<b>limelight</b>	The focus of public attention. <i>The shock win has thrust him into the <b>limelight</b>.</i>
<b>lurid</b>	Unpleasantly bright in colour, especially so as to create a harsh or unnatural effect. <i><b>Lurid</b> food colourings.</i>
<b>nod</b>	Signify or express greeting assent or understanding by nodding. <i>He <b>noded</b> his approval.</i>
<b>ogle</b>	Look at with amorous intentions. <i>A vaguely erotic <b>ogle</b>.</i>
<b>scowl</b>	Frown in an angry or bad-tempered way. <i>She <b>scowled</b> at him defiantly.</i>
<b>shoulder</b>	Make progress by shouldering someone or something out of one s way. <i>A jacket with padded <b>shoulders</b>.</i>
<b>shrug</b>	An act or instance of shrugging one s shoulders. <i>He just <b>shrugged</b> and didn t look interested.</i>
<b>spotlight</b>	Illuminate with a spotlight. <i>She was constantly in the media <b>spotlight</b>.</i>
<b>stare</b>	Be unpleasantly prominent or striking. <i>He <b>stared</b> at her in amazement.</i>
