Associations of "Frowned upon" (30 Words)

afire	Lighted up by or as by fire or flame. <i>The whole mill was afire.</i>
alight	To come to rest, settle. <i>The conductor alights to push the cable car completely around.</i>
angry	Feeling or showing strong annoyance, displeasure, or hostility; full of anger. <i>Why are you angry with me.</i>
choleric	(in medieval medicine) having cholera as the predominant bodily humour. <i>A choleric outburst.</i>
dazzle	To cause someone to lose clear vision, especially from intense light. <i>I was dazzled by the beauty and breadth of the exhibition.</i>
discourage	Deprive of courage or hope take away hope from cause to feel discouraged. <i>We should discourage this practice among our youth.</i>
face	The part of an animal corresponding to the human face. <i>Jackson faced Smith in the boxing ring.</i>
filament	A slender threadlike object or fibre, especially one found in animal or plant structures. <i>Each myosin filament is usually surrounded by 12 actin filaments.</i>
flame	A brilliant orange red colour like that of flames. <i>Warm the whisky slightly pour over the lobster and flame it.</i>
flaming	(of a gay man) having a manner or appearance regarded as stereotypically homosexual. <i>Her flaming hair.</i>
flare	Become flared and widen usually at one end. <i>Infection can cause a lupus flare.</i>
flash	A newsflash. <i>A shooting star flashed and was gone.</i>

fury	A surge of violent anger or other strong feeling. <i>In a fury he lashed the horse on.</i>
gawk	Look with amazement; look stupidly. <i>They were gawking at some pin up.</i>
glare	An angry stare. <i>The moon glared back at itself from the lake s surface.</i>
gleam	An appearance of reflected light. <i>Affection gleamed in her large green eyes.</i>
glower	Look at with a fixed gaze. <i>The angry glower on the face of the policeman.</i>
illuminate	Decorate (a building or structure) with lights for a special occasion. <i>His face was illuminated by a smile.</i>
illumine	Light up; brighten. <i>He moved her lamp so that her face was illuminated.</i>
inflammable	Easily set on fire. <i>Inflammable materials.</i>
irascible	Quickly aroused to anger. <i>An irascible and difficult man.</i>
limelight	The focus of public attention. <i>The shock win has thrust him into the limelight.</i>
lurid	Unpleasantly bright in colour, especially so as to create a harsh or unnatural effect. <i>Lurid food colourings.</i>
nod	Signify or express greeting assent or understanding by nodding. <i>He noded his approval.</i>
ogle	Look at with amorous intentions. <i>A vaguely erotic ogle.</i>
scowl	Frown in an angry or bad-tempered way. <i>She scowled at him defiantly.</i>
shoulder	Make progress by shouldering someone or something out of one s way. <i>A jacket with padded shoulders.</i>
shrug	An act or instance of shrugging one s shoulders. <i>He just shrugged and didn t look interested.</i>
spotlight	Illuminate with a spotlight. <i>She was constantly in the media spotlight.</i>
stare	Be unpleasantly prominent or striking. <i>He stared at her in amazement.</i>
