## Frozen as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Frozen" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “frozen” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Preserved by freezing sufficiently rapidly to retain flavor and nutritional value.*
- *Absolutely still.*
- *(of a liquid) having turned into ice as a result of extreme cold.*
- *Devoid of warmth and cordiality; expressive of unfriendliness or disdain.*
- *Incapable of being changed or moved or undone.*
- *Incapable of being changed or moved or undone; e.g.*
- *Not thawed.*
- *(used of foods) preserved by freezing sufficiently rapidly to retain flavor and nutritional value.*
- *Covered or rigid with ice.*
- *Turned into ice; affected by freezing or by long and severe cold.*
- *(used hyperbolically) very cold.*
- *(of food) stored at a very low temperature in order to preserve it.*
- *(of a ball) resting against another ball or a cushion.*

- *Not convertible to cash.*

<b>arctic</b>	Of or relating to the Arctic. <i>An <b>arctic</b> climate.</i>
<b>chilled</b>	(of food or drink) cooled in a refrigerator. <i>By Sunday evening I m usually feeling pretty <b>chilled</b>.</i>
<b>extreme</b>	Far beyond a norm in quantity or amount or degree; to an utmost degree. <i>In <b>extreme</b> cases the soldier may be discharged.</i>
<b>fixed</b>	Having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>With eyes set in a <b>fixed</b> glassy stare.</i>
<b>flash-frozen</b>	Preserved by freezing sufficiently rapidly to retain flavor and nutritional value.

<b>freezing</b>	(of fog or rain) consisting of droplets which freeze rapidly on contact with a surface to form ice crystals. <i>It was <b>freezing</b> cold outside.</i>
<b>frigid</b>	Devoid of warmth and cordiality; expressive of unfriendliness or disdain. <i>A <b>frigid</b> day.</i>
<b>frosted</b>	(of lipstick, eyeshadow, or nail varnish) having a pale, pearlescent sheen. <i>There was <b>frosted</b> glass on the office door.</i>
<b>frosty</b>	Covered with frost. <i>A cold and <b>frosty</b> morning.</i>
<b>frozen stiff</b>	Devoid of warmth and cordiality; expressive of unfriendliness or disdain.
<b>glacial</b>	Extremely slow (like the movement of a glacier). <i>A <b>glacial</b> lake.</i>
<b>ice-cold</b>	As cold as ice.
<b>iced</b>	(of a surface or object) covered or coated with ice. <i>Campari and soda in a tall <b>iced</b> glass.</i>
<b>icy</b>	Very cold. <i><b>Icy</b> northern waters.</i>
<b>numb</b>	So frightened as to be unable to move; stunned or paralyzed with terror; petrified. <i>The tragic events left us shocked and <b>numb</b>.</i>
<b>numb with cold</b>	Not showing human feeling or sensitivity; unresponsive.
<b>numbed</b>	So frightened as to be unable to move; stunned or paralyzed with terror; petrified.
<b>polar</b>	Having electrical or magnetic polarity. <i><b>Polar</b> weather.</i>
<b>preserved</b>	Prevented from decaying or spoiling and prepared for future use. <i><b>Preserved</b> manuscripts.</i>
<b>quick-frozen</b>	Preserved by freezing sufficiently rapidly to retain flavor and nutritional value.
<b>raw</b>	Used of wood and furniture. <i><b>Raw</b> sugar.</i>
<b>rooted</b>	Exhausted; worn out. <i>The front wheel looks <b>rooted</b>.</i>
<b>siberian</b>	Of speech sounds produced by forcing air through a constricted passage (as `f', `s', `z', or `th' in both `thin' and `then).
<b>stock-still</b>	Absolutely still.
<b>very cold</b>	Precisely as stated.

**wintry** Characteristic of winter, especially in feeling or looking very cold and bleak.  
**Wintry smile.**

<b>antarctic</b>	The region around the south pole: Antarctica and surrounding waters.
<b>arctic</b>	The regions to the north of the Arctic Circle centered on the North Pole. <i>An <b>arctic</b> climate.</i>
<b>cold</b>	A low temperature cold weather a cold environment. <i>Had her lines <b>cold</b> before rehearsals started.</i>
<b>coldness</b>	(in reference to colour) the quality of containing pale blue or grey. <i>He replied with <b>coldness</b> in his voice.</i>
<b>cryogenic</b>	Relating to or involving the branch of physics that deals with the production and effects of very low temperatures. <i>A body being prepared for <b>cryogenic</b> preservation.</i>
<b>floe</b>	A sheet of floating ice.
<b>freezing</b>	The freezing point of water 0 C. <i>It was <b>freezing</b> cold outside.</i>

<b>frigid</b>	Extremely cold. <i>Frigid</i> water.
<b>frostbitten</b>	Injured by freezing or partial freezing. <i>Frostbitten</i> grapes unsalable as fresh fruit.
<b>frosty</b>	Covered with frost. A <i>frosty</i> glass.
<b>gelid</b>	Icy; extremely cold. She gave a <i>gelid</i> reply.
<b>glacial</b>	A glacial period. An official described progress in the talks as <i>glacial</i> .
<b>ice</b>	A frozen mixture of fruit juice or of flavoured water and sugar. The <i>ice</i> in his <i>voice</i> was only to hide the pain.
<b>iceberg</b>	Lettuce with crisp tightly packed light-green leaves in a firm head. <i>Iceberg</i> is still the most popular lettuce.
<b>icecap</b>	A mass of ice and snow that permanently covers a large area of land (e.g., the polar regions or a mountain peak).
<b>icicle</b>	Ice resembling a pendent spear, formed by the freezing of dripping water.
<b>icy</b>	Extremely cold. Her voice was <i>icy</i> .
<b>polar</b>	Of an animal or plant living in the north or south polar region. Most <i>polar</i> birds breed seasonally.
<b>preserved</b>	Maintained in its original or existing state. <i>Preserved</i> manuscripts.
<b>refrigeration</b>	Deliberately lowering the body's temperature for therapeutic purposes. Commercial <i>refrigeration</i> units.
<b>rime</b>	Ice crystals forming a white deposit (especially on objects outside). He does not brush away the frost that <i>rimes</i> his beard.
<b>saved</b>	Guarded from injury or destruction. A <i>saved</i> soul.
<b>sherbet</b>	A flavoured sweet effervescent powder eaten alone or made into a drink. I went down the local pub for a few <i>sherbets</i> .
<b>sleet</b>	Sleet falls. If the temperature rises above freezing it will probably <i>sleet</i> .
<b>snow</b>	Fall as snow. We were trudging through deep <i>snow</i> .
<b>snowfall</b>	Precipitation falling from clouds in the form of ice crystals. The average <i>snowfall</i> is 75 m a year.

- snowy** (of weather or a period of time) characterized by snowfall.  
*A long **snowy** winter.*
- standoffish** Lacking cordiality; unfriendly.  
*A **standoffish** manner.*
- winter** Spend the winter.  
*The tree has a good crop of berries in **winter**.*
- wintry** Characteristic of or occurring in winter.  
*Brown **wintry** grasses.*
